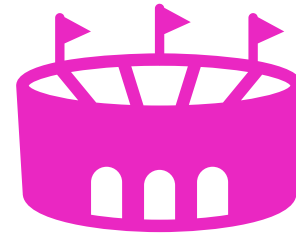

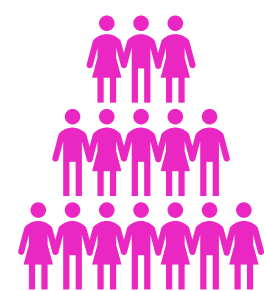

Local Area Traffic Management and Parking Plans (LATMP)

What is it?

Event day temporary traffic management and parking restrictions to protect residents, businesses and to support the venue operations during the Games Period

Impact on you?

Traffic management and parking restrictions will be in place

Areas will be very busy particularly at the start and end of event sessions

Where is it?

LATMPs will be introduced at all competition and non-competition venues

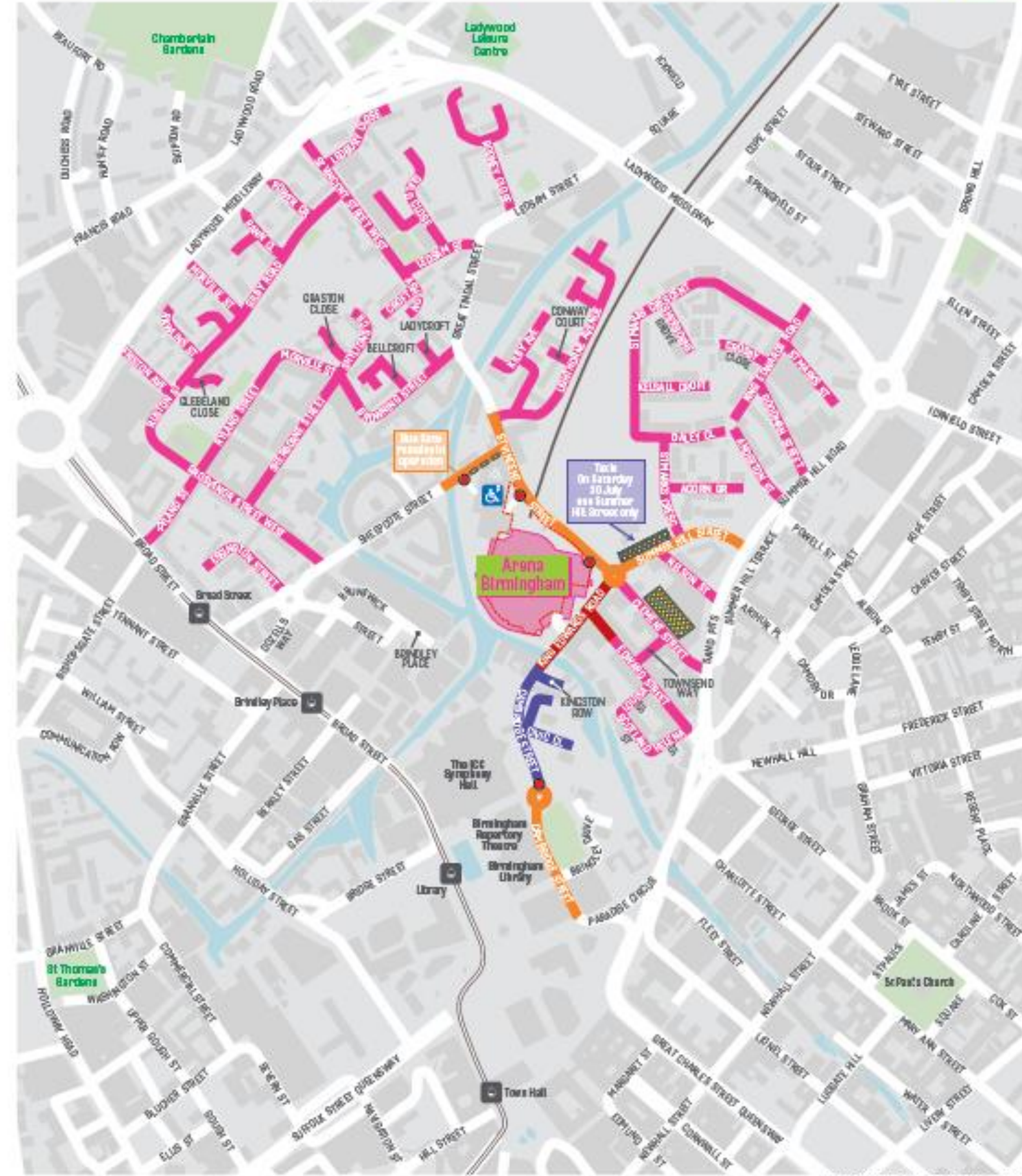
Top Tips

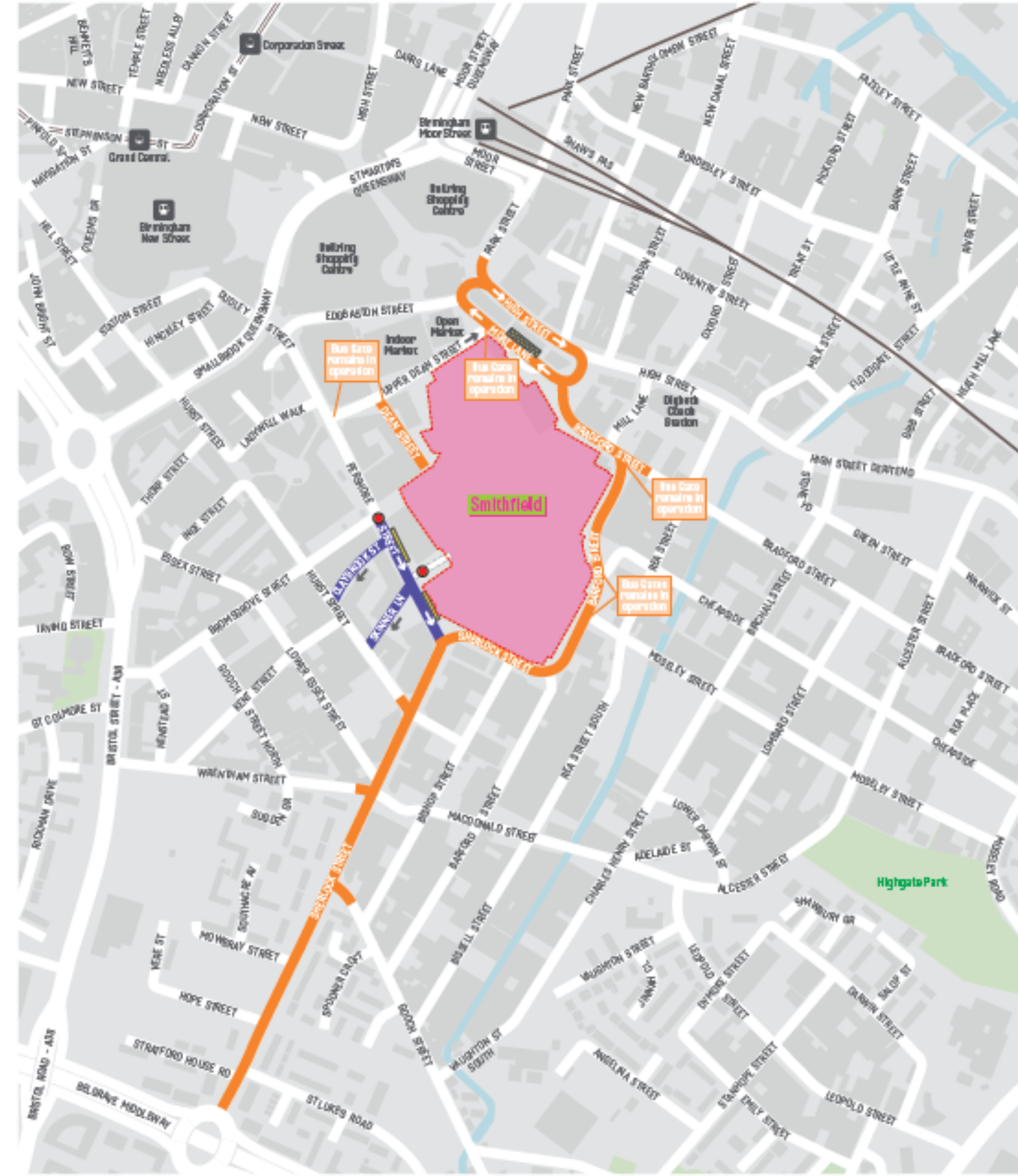

PHV will not be able to access this location due to the bus gates on Upper Dean Street.

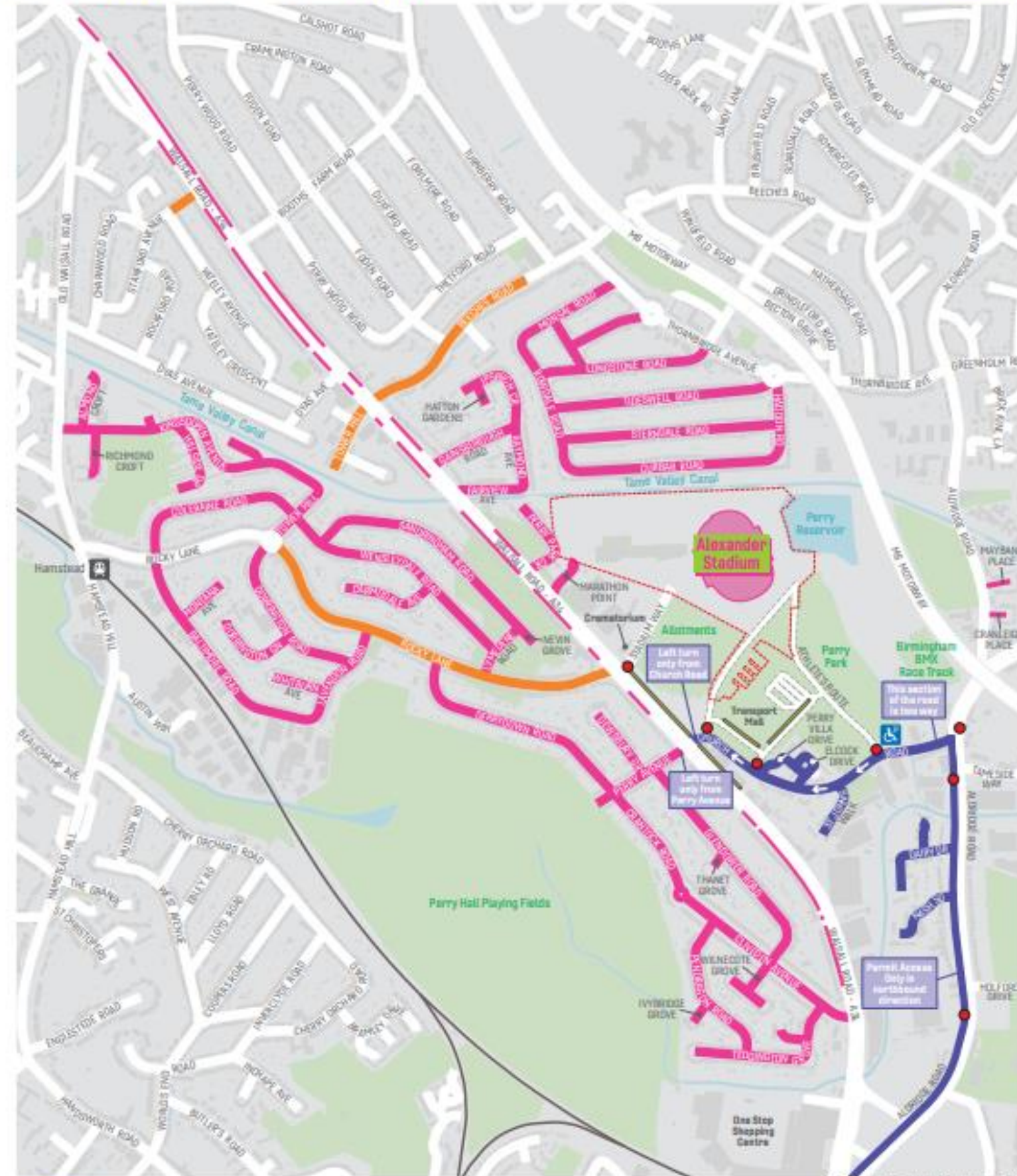
Users are advised to pre-order a taxi for their pick up at the end of their session.

Taxi Drop Off

There are no designated taxi drop off or pick up points near the venue.

Please be aware there are parking and access restrictions on local roads near the venue and therefore taxis may have to drop/collect a distance from the venue entrance.

Accessible taxis:

Drop off on Perry Avenue, a short walk to the venue entrance.

Accessibility support staff and loan wheelchairs will be available at the drop off point if needed for customers.

New St Station/ Smallbrook Queensway:

The taxi rank on Smallbrook Queensway will be suspended. A call up service with ranking on Theatre Approach to the taxi rank on Eastern Plaza will be put in place.

There will be “No Stopping” except for buses:

- **6.30am to Midnight and from Midnight to 6.30am
(24 hours a day)**
- **Loading and unloading only (maximum stay 20
minutes and no return within 1 hour)**

**This will be in operation from the 26th July to the 9th
August.**

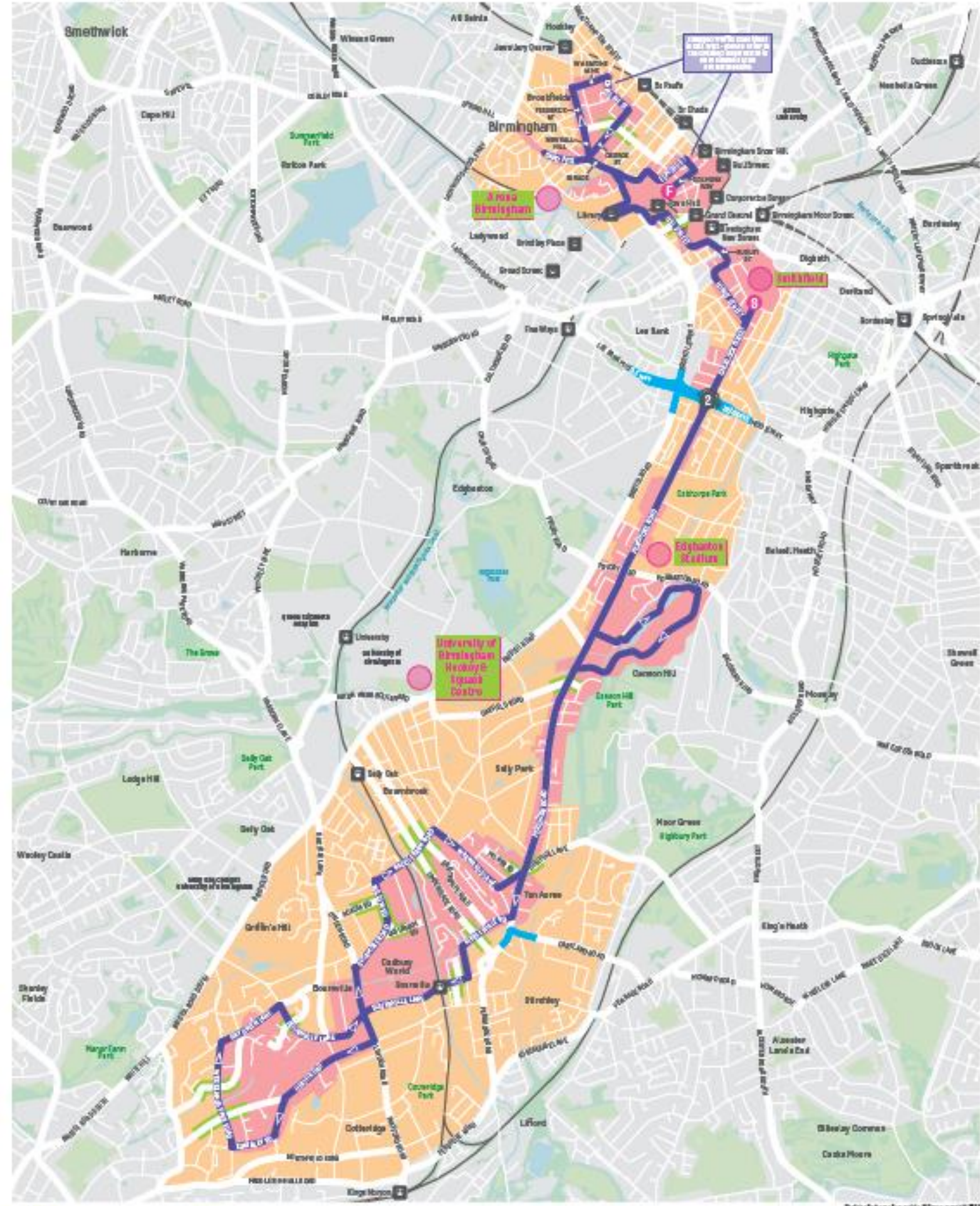

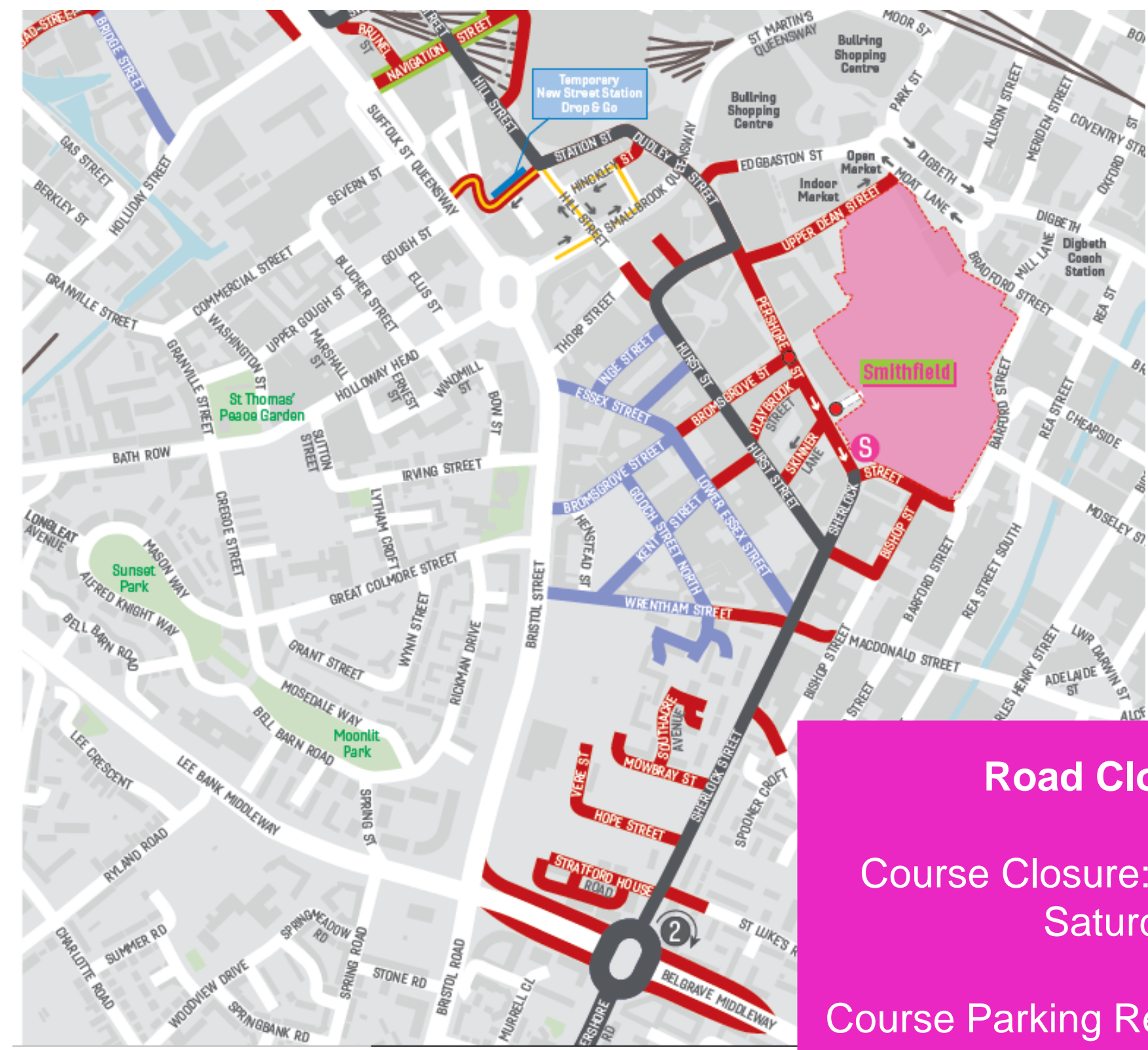
