Building on and expanding our flag ship programs of GAPS and Equip will be high on our agenda as well.

Leveraging and fostering strategic partnerships will be another feature of our tenure. We intend to promote mutually beneficially partnerships at national, regional and international levels to enable us attained our envisaged activities mentioned above. Commonwealth sport needs to engage more intentional actors such as the Commonwealth Secretariat, the corporate world, regional and international bodies to advance our objectives and shared visions.
