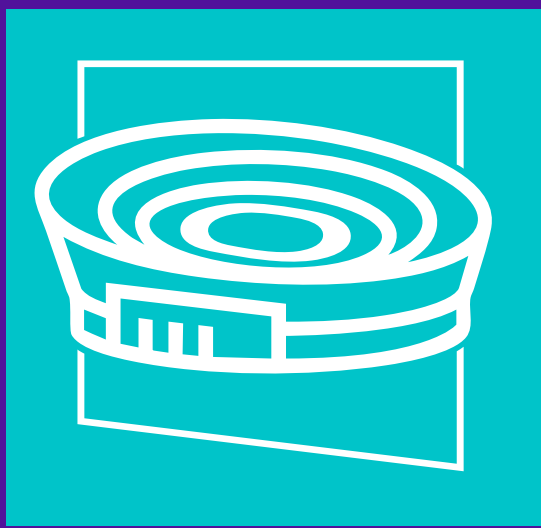

ABOUT THE VENUE



The Glasgow International Arena in Dalmarnock was opened in October 2012 and was purpose-built for the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games. It has since become a key destination for major sporting events.

The Glasgow International Arena is the home of the Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome, named in honour one of Scotland's most celebrated athletes, with 11 World Championship titles, six Olympic gold medals and two Commonwealth Games titles.

It is also home to The Arena, a flexible multi-purpose facility that has been adapted for a variety of sporting fields of play and previously hosted the Badminton competition during Glasgow 2014.

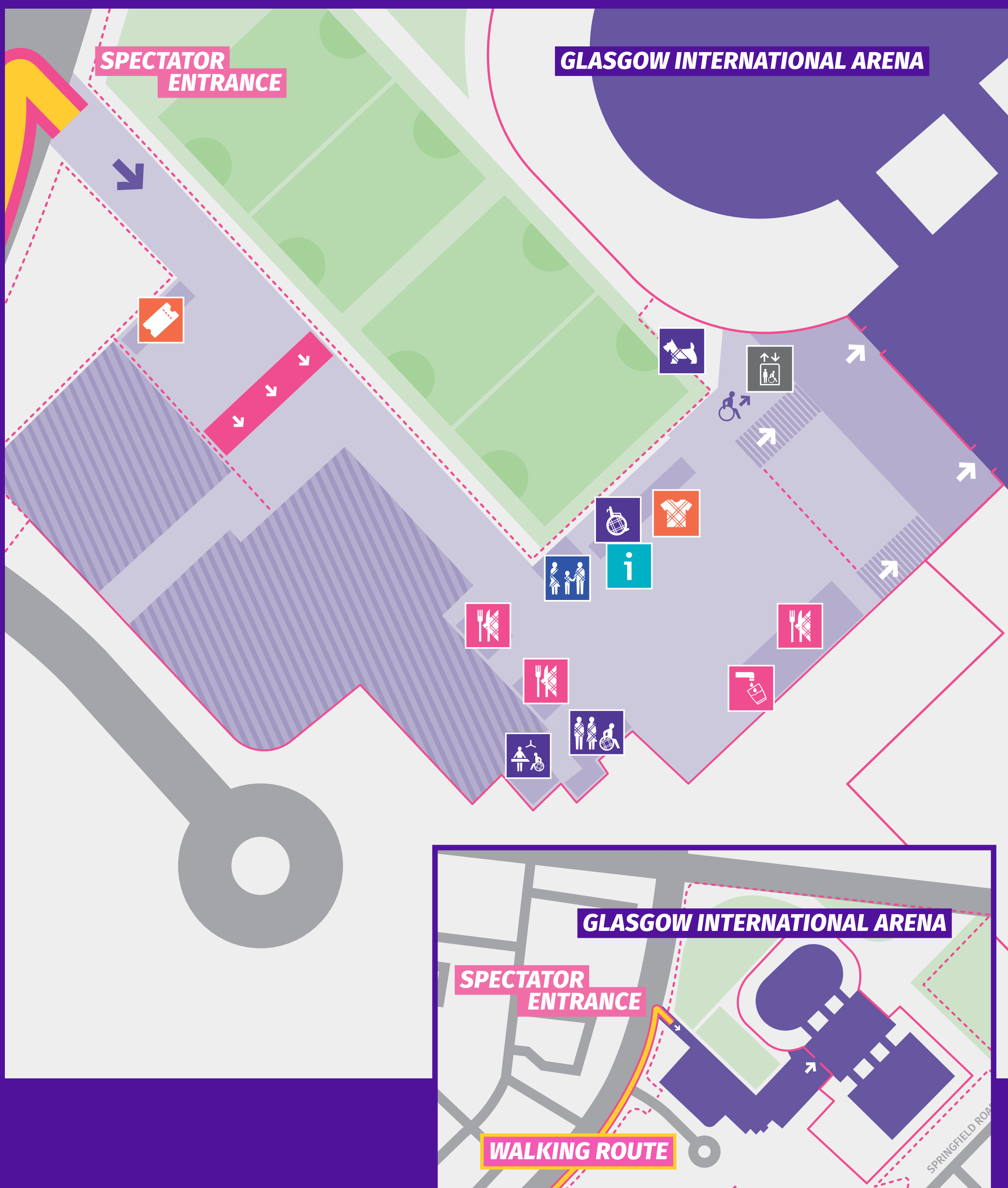

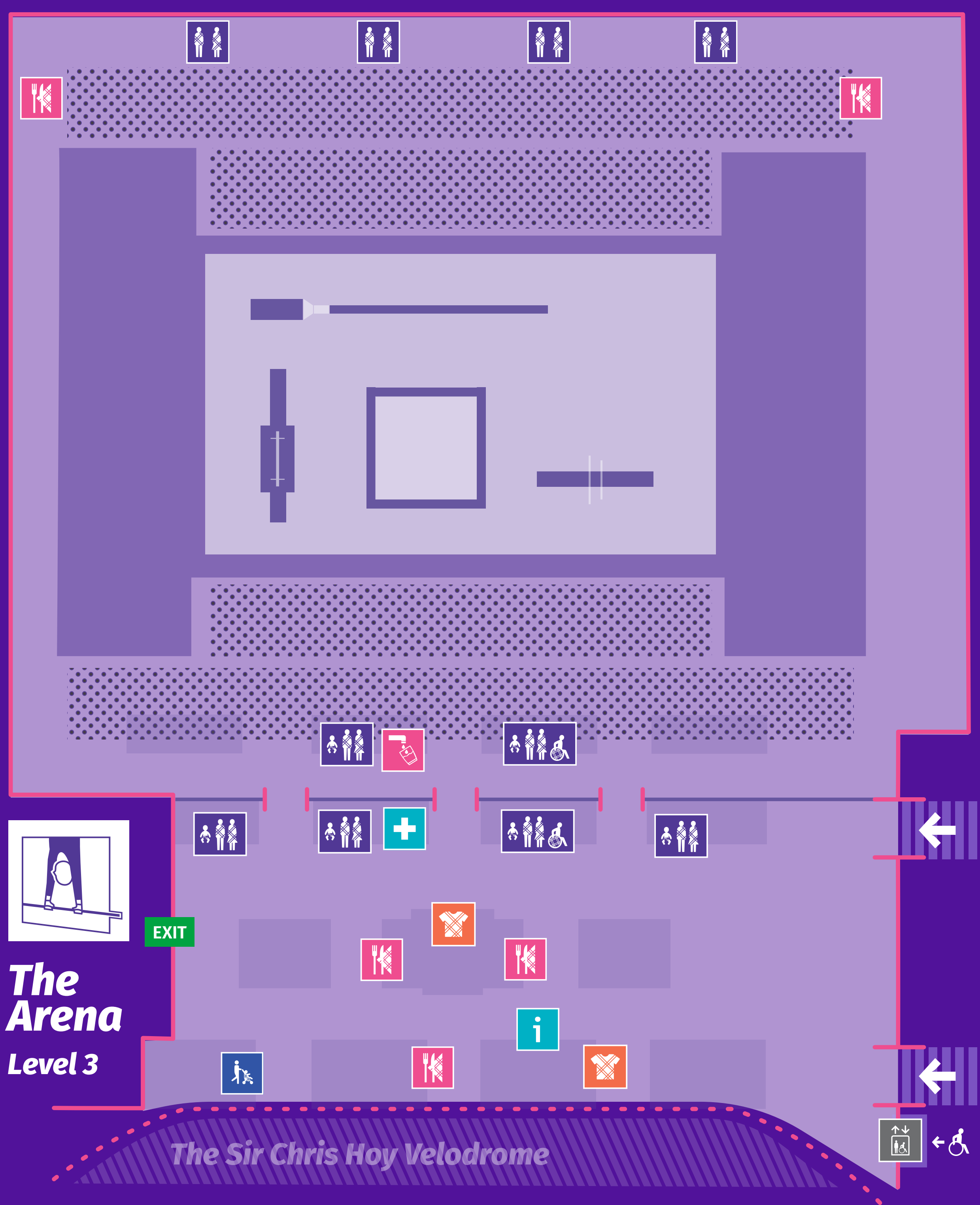


THE ARENA SPECTATOR PLAZA MAP

– SUNDAY 2 AUGUST**

Track Cycling has appeared at every Commonwealth Games since the second edition, which was held in London in 1934.

Australia is the most successful nation in Track Cycling followed by England and New Zealand.

Women's Track Cycling was not introduced into the Games until 1990. However, since the Gold Coast Games in 2018 parity between the sexes has been the norm.

Para Track Cycling was introduced at Glasgow 2014 and has been increased to eight medal events for Glasgow 2026.

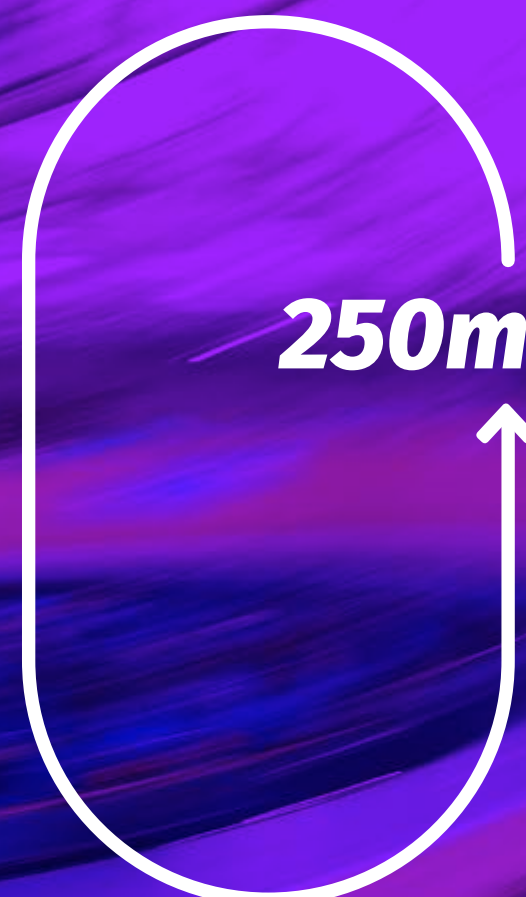
DID YOU KNOW?

Track Cycling events are the fastest competitions within the Games, with athletes reaching speeds of up to 50kph (30mph)!

The angle of the banked corners is 42 degrees.



The velodrome is 250m long.



TRAVEL

GETTING TO AND FROM GLASGOW INTERNATIONAL ARENA

BY TRAIN:

The primary station for access to the venue is Dalmarnock, which is served by trains on the Argyle Line. Dalmarnock Station is approximately 0.4 miles from the Glasgow International Arena, with a 10–15 minute walk to the Spectator Entrance. The route from the station will be signposted to the venue. The route is step-free and level, with wide paths that are easy to navigate for everyone.

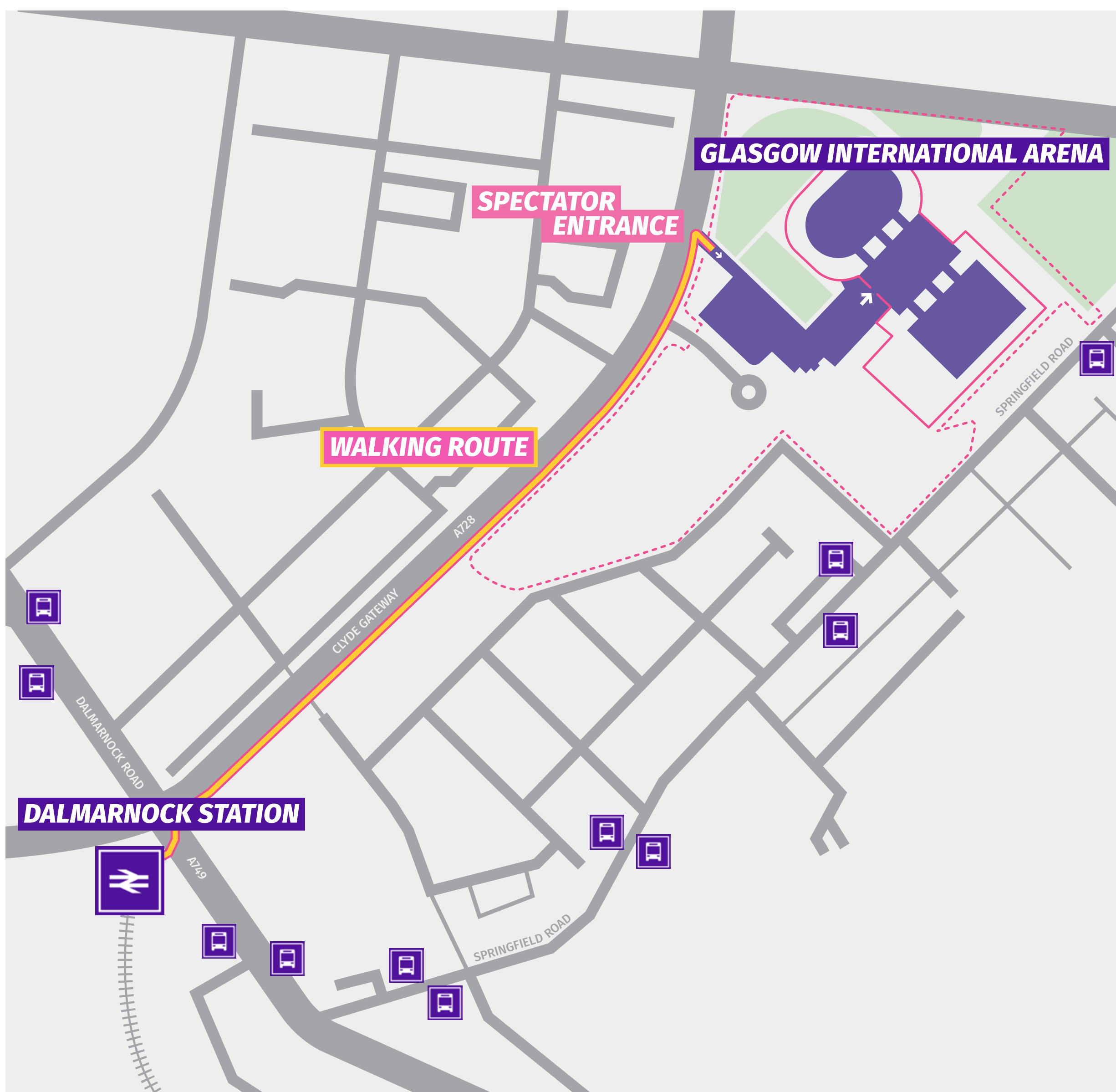
BY BUS:

Bus stops are located on Dalmarnock Road, south of Dalmarnock rail station (routes 18, 18A, 46, 65, 263) and Springfield Road, east of Dalmarnock Road (routes 90, 189, 190). Bus stops are covered and have seating incorporated. All buses are low floor and easy access.

Please access the venue via the designated walking route and Spectator Entrance.

MAP SHOWING BUS AND TRAIN LOCATIONS

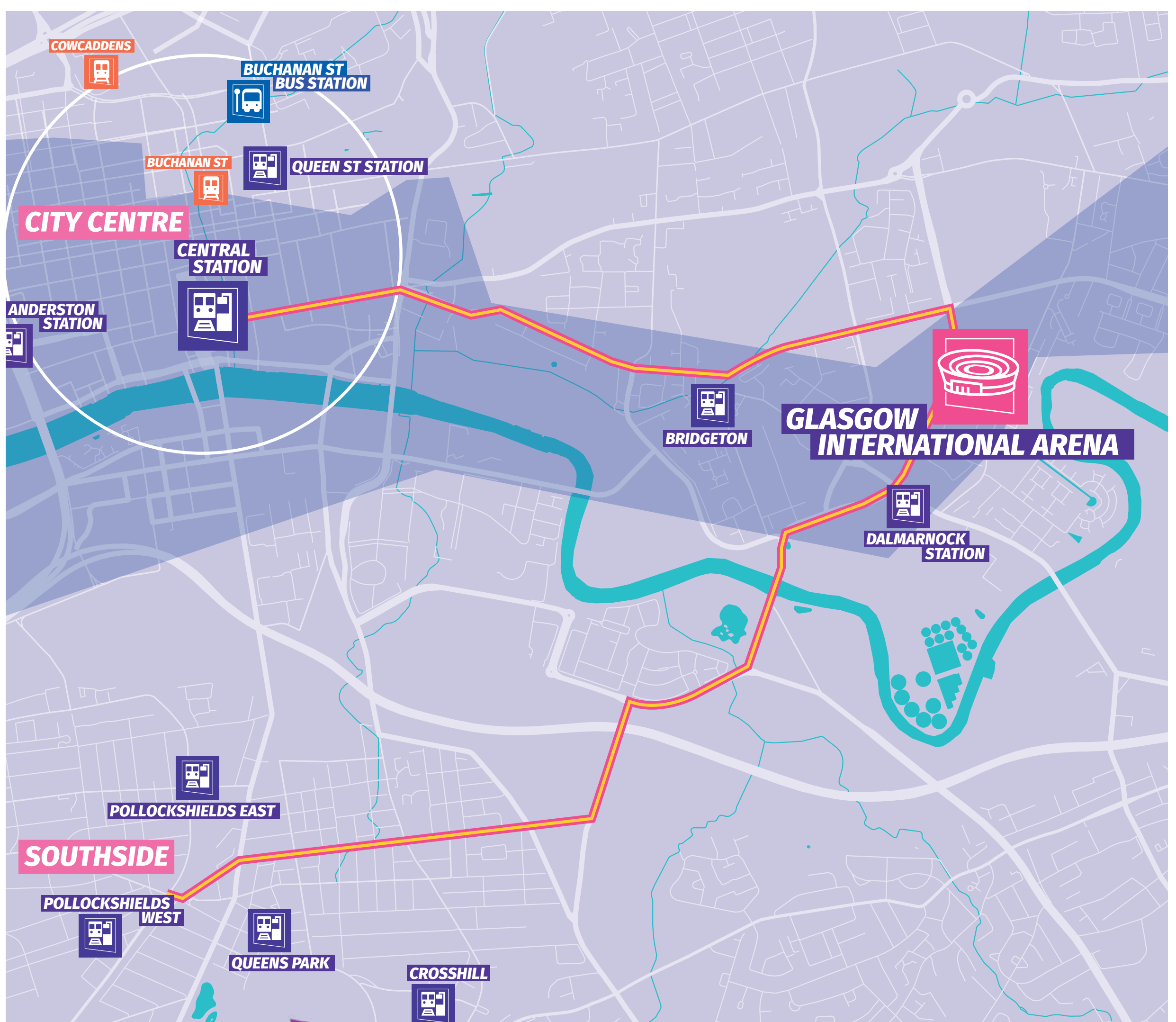


GETTING TO AND FROM GLASGOW INTERNATIONAL ARENA CONT.

BY FOOT OR WHEEL:

The two most direct walking and wheeling routes to and from the city centre are via Glasgow Green and London Road.

The distance is between 2–3 miles and takes approximately 40–60 minutes on foot, depending on the starting point in the city centre. This is a longer route which includes some slopes and changes in level.



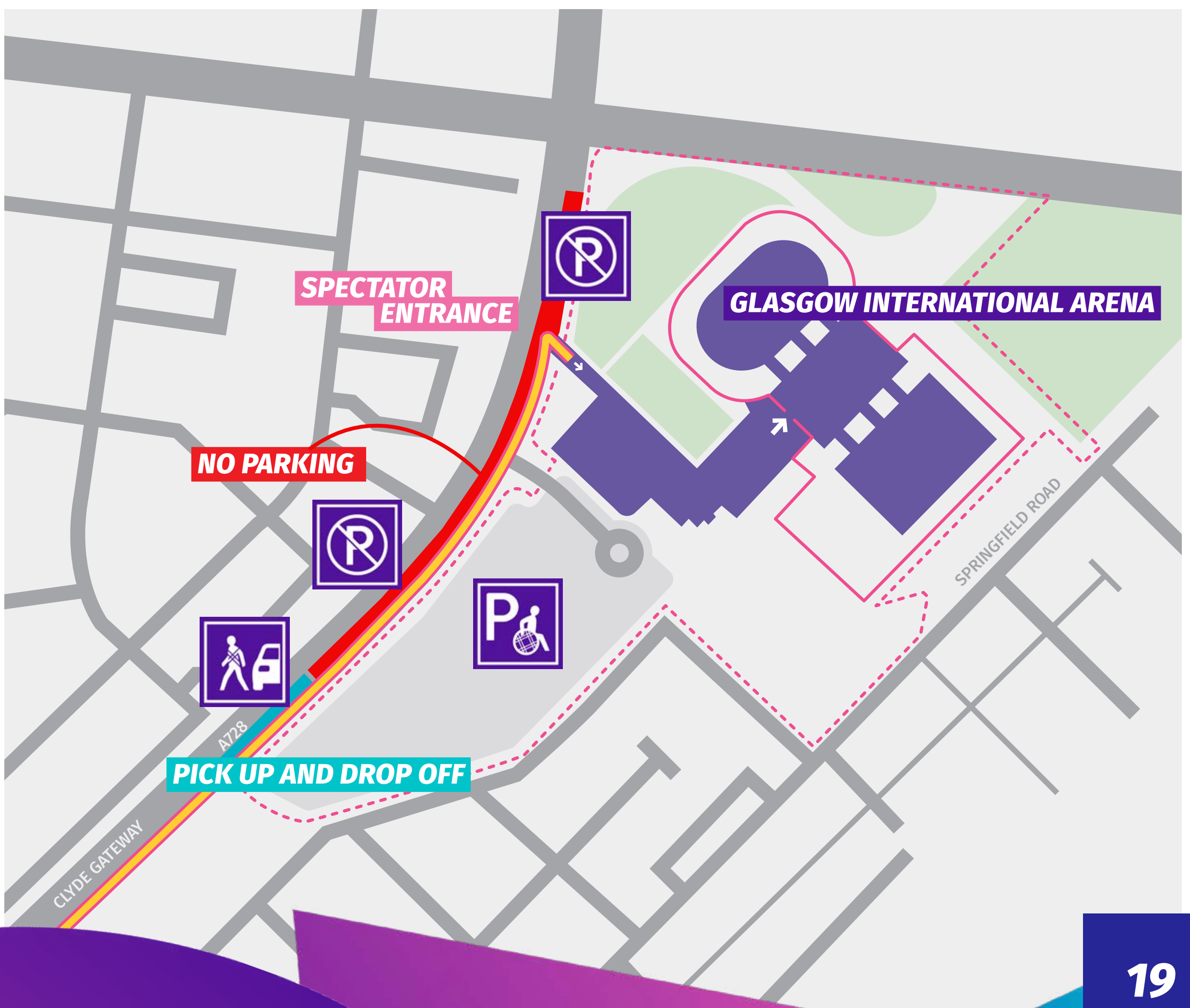
GETTING TO AND FROM GLASGOW INTERNATIONAL ARENA CONT.

BY CAR:

There will be no parking anywhere in or around the venue with the exception of pre-booked Blue Badge parking.

We ask our spectators to use public transport or active travel routes to arrive and depart from the venue.

Please note that there is an exclusion parking zone around the venue which is heavily patrolled and enforced on event days. Parking is strictly for residents only.

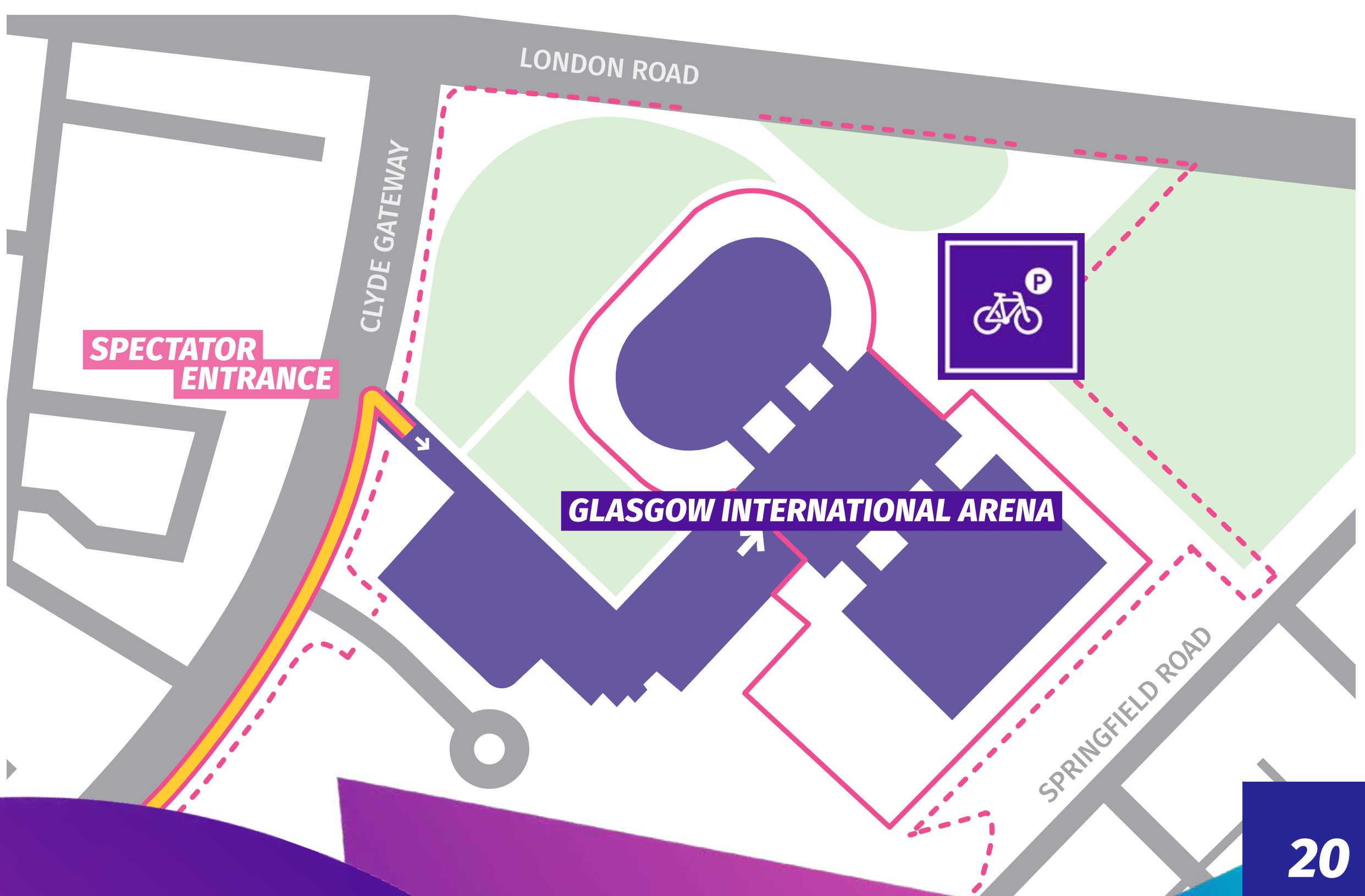
BY BIKE:

Bike parking will be located off London Road on the north side of the venue. Spaces are limited and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The bike parking is a self-service “lock and leave” area with plenty of room for everything from standard pedal bikes to larger frames.

Although barriered, the zone is not monitored and spectators will be responsible for securing their own bike. All bikes are left entirely at the owner’s risk.

Please access the venue via the designated walking route and Spectator Entrance.

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

There is no cost to park, but you do need to book in advance, as spaces are limited and will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

You will need to hold a Blue Badge to be permitted entry to the parking area.

VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Plan your journey and give yourself plenty of time to get to the venue. Please follow the rules and regulations of the event and venue.

Spectators will have access to the venue 90 minutes prior to the commencement of competition.

There will be no re-entry to the venue once the tickets have been validated. If you have any accessibility requirements, there are a wide range of accessible facilities available inside the venue.

The Spectator Entrance to the venue is off Clyde Gateway, next to the existing 5-a-side pitches.

An accessible queue will be open to people who have specific accessibility requirements or who are unable to stand for long periods of time. However, please note that all spectators may have to queue on arrival to enter the venue, even at our accessible entrances.

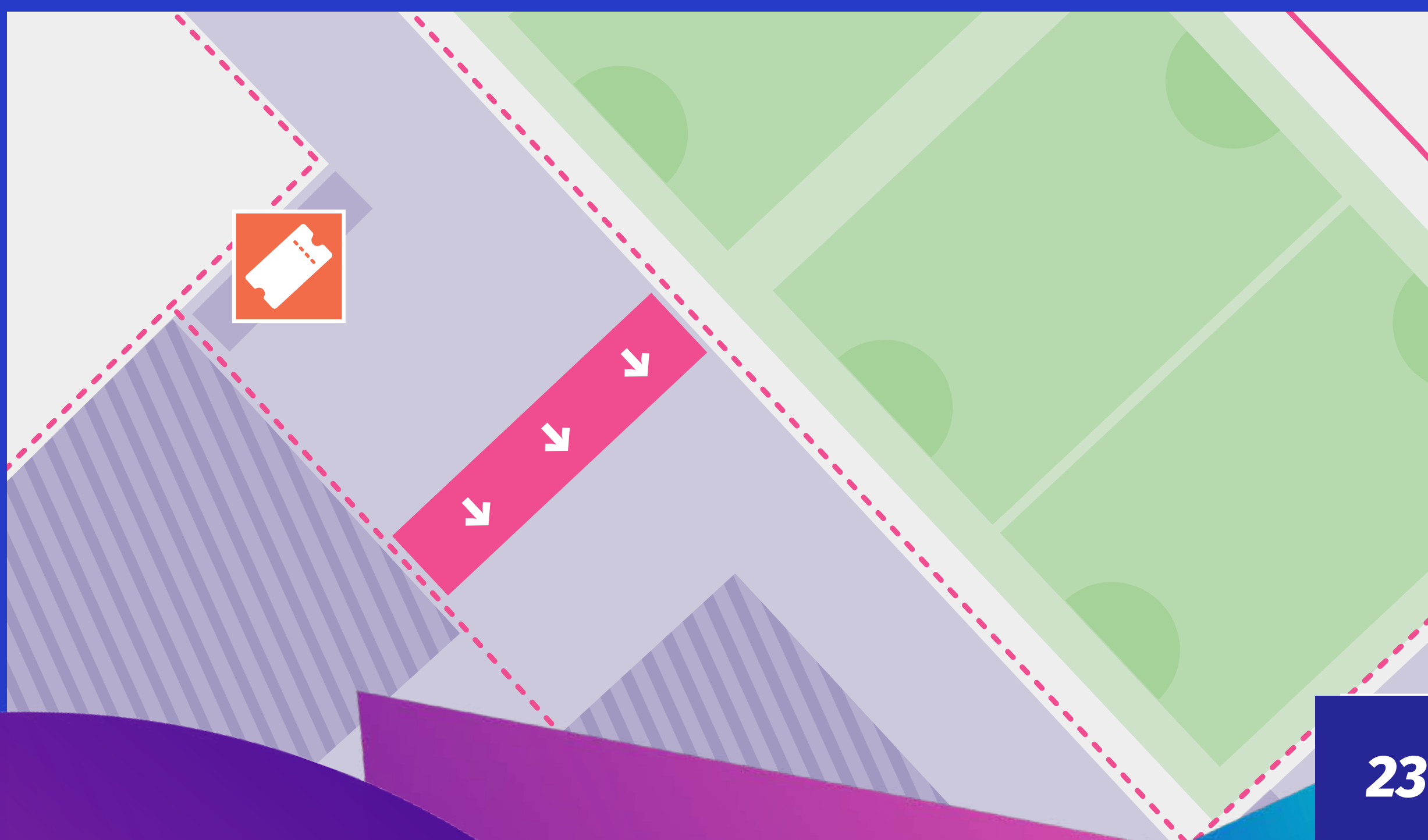
At the entrance, spectators will go through a security check before having their tickets scanned and validated.

VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION CONT.

Internet and mobile signal can sometimes be variable, so make sure you have added your ticket(s) to your mobile wallet or downloaded them before you arrive. Please note that screenshots of tickets will not be permitted. More information on Tickets is [available here](#).

If you have a ticket(s) for a second session on the same day, please note you will need to leave the venue after the first session ends. Each session is treated as a separate event and you will need to have your second session ticket(s) scanned before re-entering the venue. The venue will open 90 minutes before the second session start time.

The Ticket Office will be located opposite the Spectator Entrance.



PROHIBITED ITEMS



Any item that is illegal to carry or possess under UK Law



Offensive weapons, knives, martial arts weapons and batons

Exceptions: Kirpan when present with other Sikh articles of faith.
Sgian-dubh worn as part of traditional Scottish dress.



Flammable substances

Flammable substances, liquids and fuel including items producing naked flames. Doesn't apply to small personal lighters.



Ambush marketing

Clothing, items, leaflets or signage with the likely purpose of engaging in Ambush Marketing.



Drones, radio transmitters, walkie talkies, radio scanners or radio jamming devices



Offensive messaging

Any item carrying wording deemed abusive, discriminatory or which may cause distress to others.



Laser pointers

Strobe lights and similar emitting devices.



Alcoholic beverages

Prohibited, unless purchased or supplied from within the venue.



Balls, rackets and frisbees

Including similar objects or projectiles and inflatables.



Any item deemed a risk to safety

Including to the bearer or other Games attendees.



Noise-making devices

Unless at specified venues communicated in the Spectator Guide.



Protest items and materials

Unless authorised by the Organising Company or Police Scotland.



Bicycles and scooters

Exception: mobility scooters and other wheeled mobility aids.



Firearms

Including hoax or replica items.



Fireworks or flares

Including pyrotechnic devices.



Glass bottles or containers



Incapacitant sprays

e.g., pepper spray



Selfie sticks



Non-prescription drugs



Portable oxygen cylinders

Unless for medical use.

RESTRICTED ITEMS



Beverage containers

One full, sealed, plastic, beverage container, or an empty resealable plastic or metal container not exceeding 750ml in volume.
No alcohol permitted.



Photography

Only mobile phones, single external (mobile phone) power sources, personal use cameras or lenses of no more than 30cm in length will be allowed. No professional and broadcast equipment including tripods and monopods are allowed except for accredited media.



Medicines

Medically prescribed in quantity for individual personal use, commercially packaged, and labelled with contents. All other non-prescribed medication at the discretion of the Security Team Leader.



Food

Limited amount for personal consumption and non-commercially branded. Including reasonable amounts of baby food, milk, formula and food for dietary needs.



Prams/baby carriers

These are not allowed in seating areas, but can be left in buggy storage at venues.



Vapes & E-cigarettes

Or other battery powered devices used to heat a liquid for personal inhalation.



Portable seats

Chairs, folding chairs, stadium seats, allowed when required for a disability or injury. At the discretion of Security Team Leader.



Animals

With the exception of certified assistance dogs.



Suncream

Up to 200ml and other liquids, aerosols, creams and gels up to 100ml in non-glass containers.



Umbrellas

Must be small enough to fit inside a small bag. Not to be opened inside the venue or stands where it would restrict the view of others. No golf umbrellas.



Flags

National flags of competing nations, Union flag, LGBTQ+ flag (and individual community flags) max size 0.5m x 1m. No flag poles. Small, hand-held flags on plastic sticks allowed. Flags of non-competing nations are restricted and should not be visible in the seating bowl.



Bags

One per person, soft-sided bags, no greater than 48cm in length, 34cm in height and 23cm in depth.

RESTRICTED ITEMS

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

All Glasgow 2026 venues are smoke-free.

Smoking, including the use of electronic cigarettes or vapes, is not permitted within any Games venue.

Photography and filming for personal use is permitted. However, tripods, monopods and other photographic equipment are considered restricted items and are not permitted inside the venue.

Please respect other spectators and their right to enjoy this event. This includes refraining from using foul and abusive language and engaging in any other disruptive behaviour.

Stay hydrated and take breaks when needed. Sporting events can be long and tiring, so make sure you take care of yourself. Refillable water bottles up to 750ml are permitted.

VENUE FACILITIES

There is one Information Point located within the Spectator Plaza, with an additional Information Desk in the venue concourse area across from the Food and Drink outlets.

The Information Point is your best place for information on the venue, the available services and the Games.

VENUE FACILITIES CONT.

Buggies, prams, and venue-loaned wheelchairs are not permitted in our general seating areas. They can be stored at our dedicated storage area located at the end of the concourse on the left-hand side. Please note, any item is left at your own risk.

Merchandise, Food and Drink outlets and Water Refill points are available across the venue with facilities inside the Spectator Plaza as well as additional units within the Spectator Concourse.

If you require medical assistance while at the venue, stewards or any member of staff will be able to support you. First Aid is located in the concourse area.

Baby Change facilities are available in the Spectator Plaza, and changing tables are present in most accessible toilets throughout the venue. Please ask a member of staff or volunteer for the nearest one.

ACCESSIBILITY

The Spectator Entrance to the venue is off Clyde Gateway, next to the existing 5-a-side pitches.

Accessible toilets are located across the venue with facilities within the main Spectator Plaza area and near to accessible seating.

A Changing Places toilet is available in the concourse near the main toilets. It will not appear on the Changing Places website as you must be a ticket holder to access this facility.

Assistive Listening Devices, including Hearing Loops are available at the Information Point in the Spectator Plaza. These are available for loan on a first-come, first-served basis from the Information Point in the venue. These must be returned to the Information Point before leaving the venue.

A wheelchair loan service, provided by Allied Mobility, is available from the Information Point. Please note wheelchair loans are to assist in travelling across the venue and will not be available to hire for the full session.

ACCESSIBILITY CONT.

The Family Rest Area in the Spectator Plaza is a shared welfare space for use by any spectator on a first-come, first-served basis.

Sensory bags will be available for loan on a first-come, first-served basis from the Information Point in the Spectator Plaza. These must be returned to the Information Desk in the main concourse upon leaving the venue.

There is an **Assistance Dog Relief Area** located to the left of the front entrance to the building behind the 5-a-side pitches.

Lifts are available to the accessible seating areas in both The Arena and the Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome.

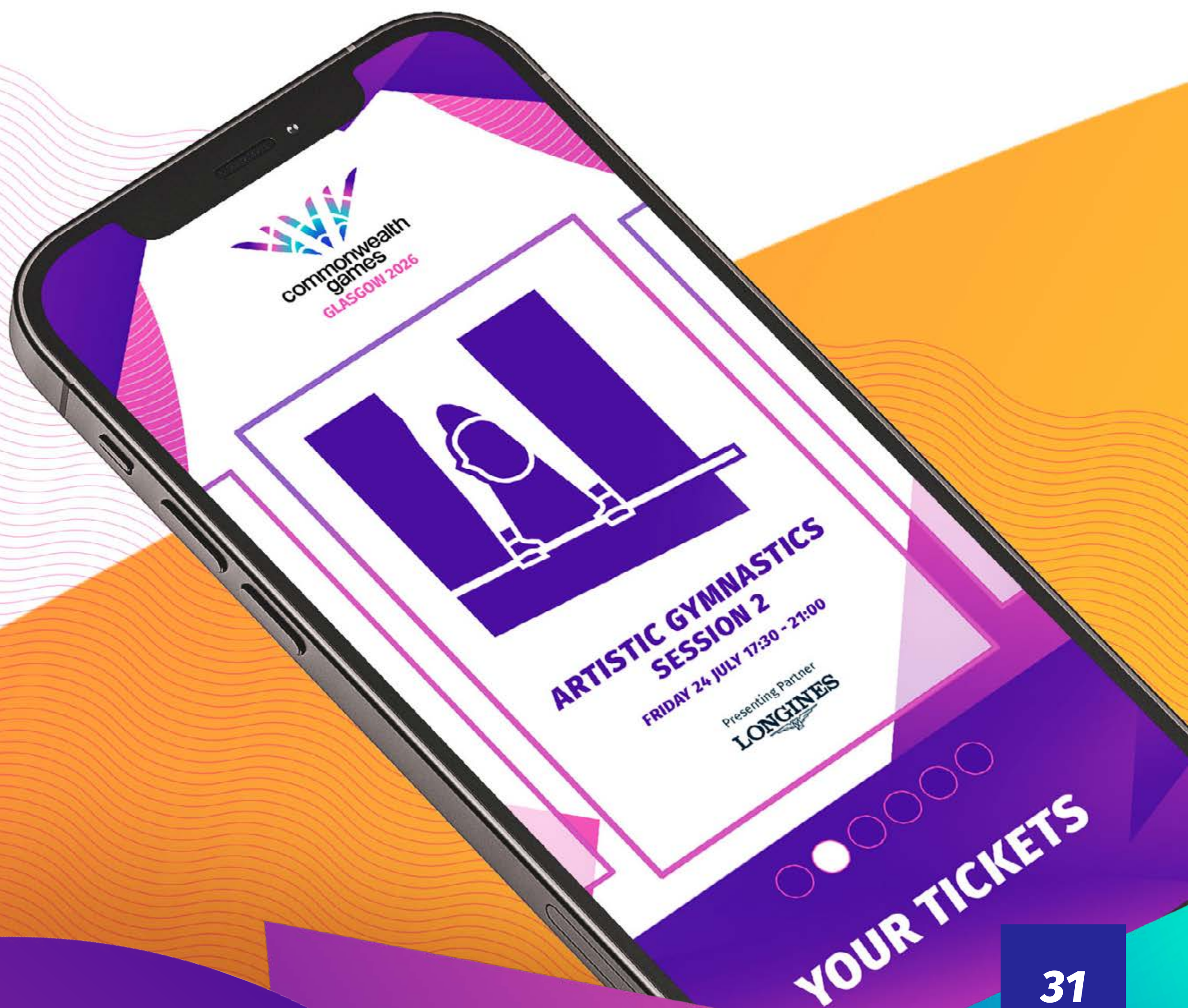


TICKETS

Your tickets will be delivered by email, with links to add them to either Apple Wallet or Google Wallet.

You will also be able to access and **download your tickets as PDFs** from your Ticketmaster Sport account.

We recommend adding your tickets to your mobile wallet or downloading them in advance, so they are ready before you travel to the venue.

When the cheering stops, make sure your rubbish lands in the right place. A little bin discipline goes a long way.

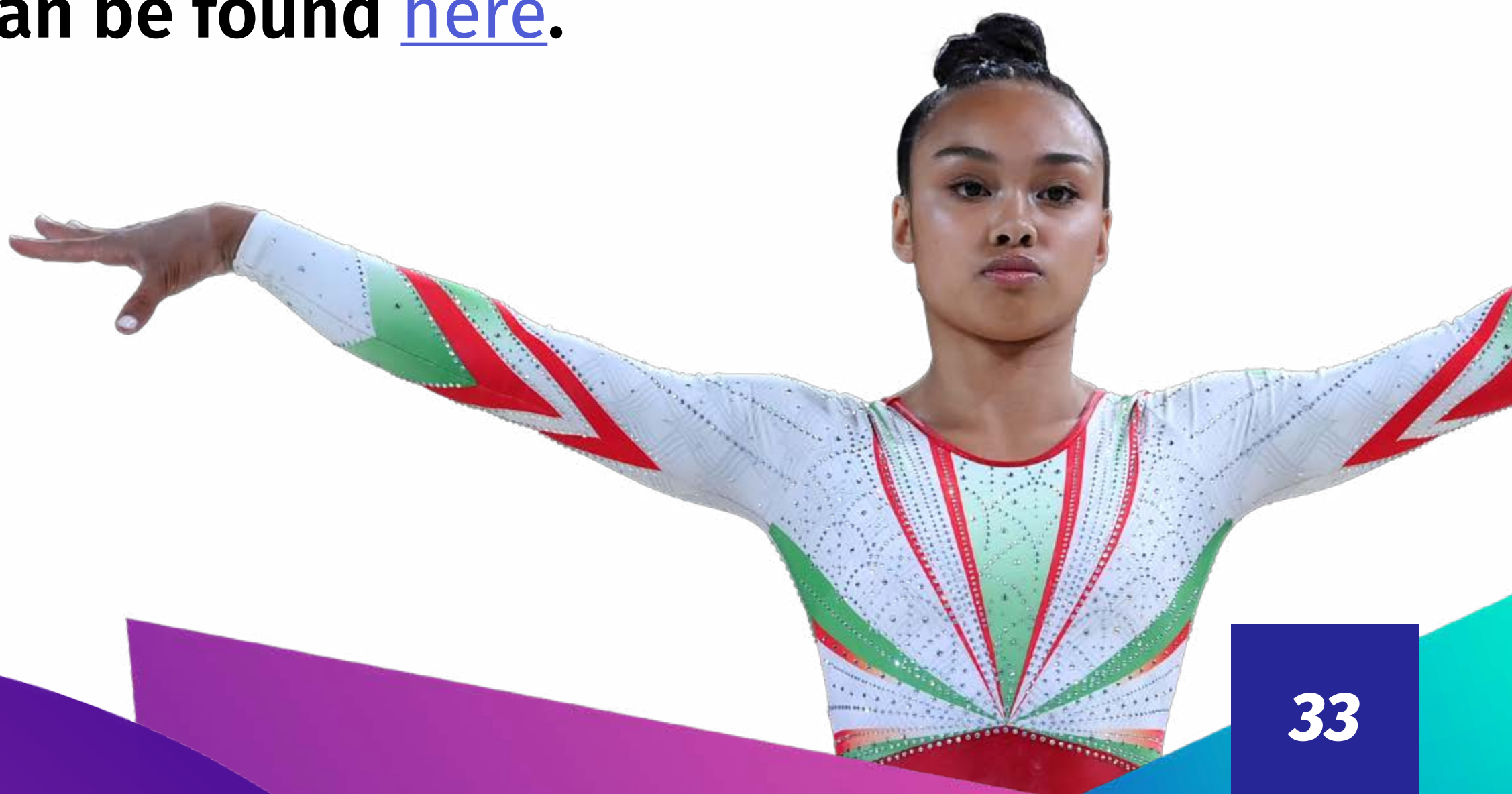
BRING A REFILLABLE WATER BOTTLE

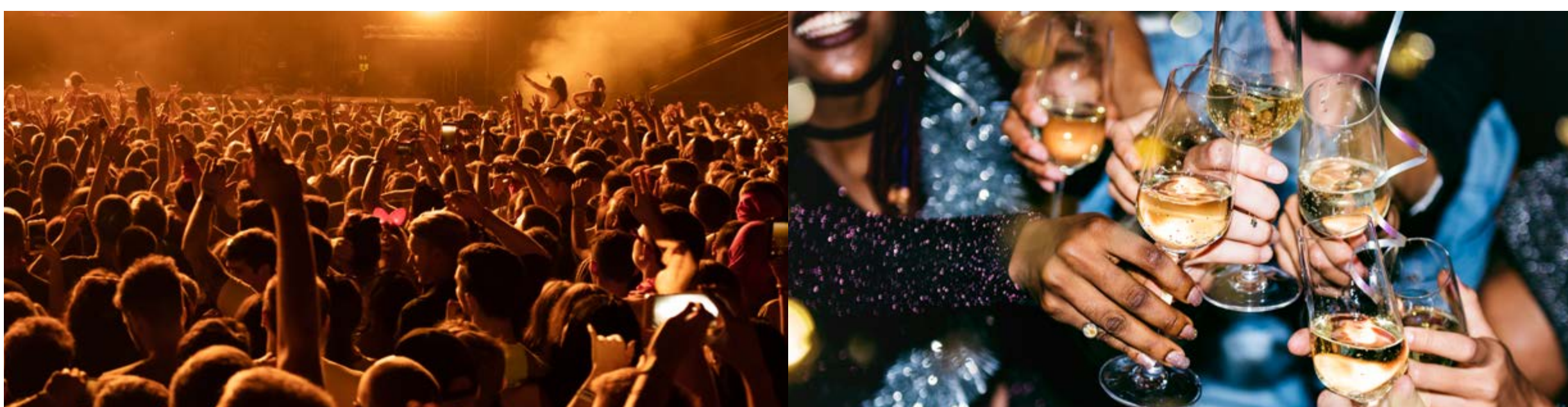
