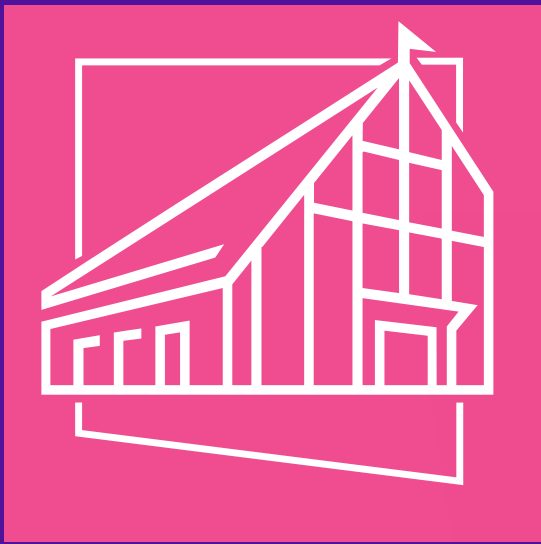

ABOUT THE VENUE

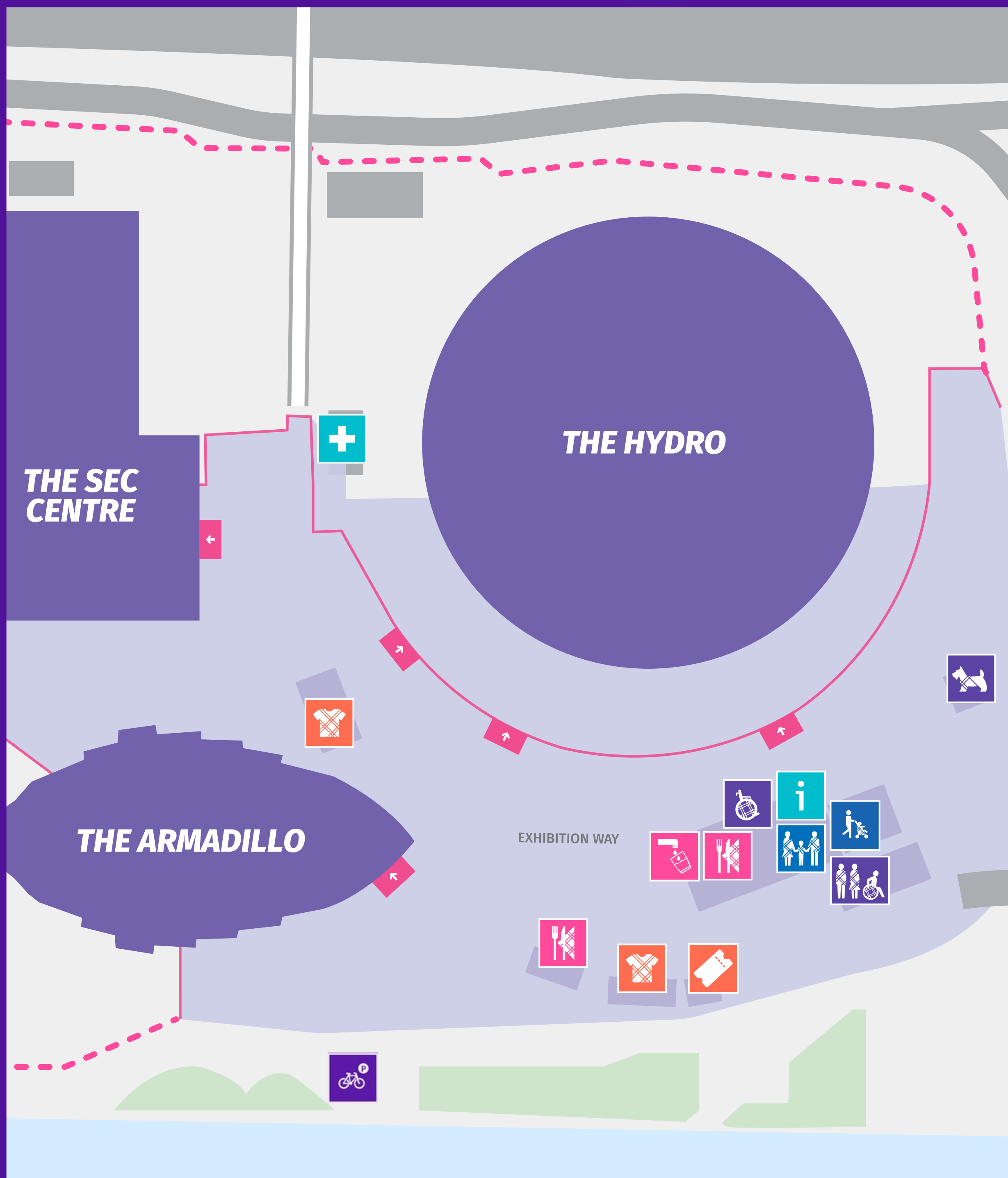


Previously known as the SECC, the SEC Centre offers five interconnected exhibition halls with a combined area of more than 22,000 square metres.

During the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games, the SEC Centre hosted the Wrestling, Judo and Boxing competitions. For Glasgow 2026, it will build on that legacy by hosting six sports – Boxing, 3x3 Basketball, 3x3 Wheelchair Basketball, Judo, Bowls and Para Bowls – welcoming thousands of athletes and spectators throughout the Games.

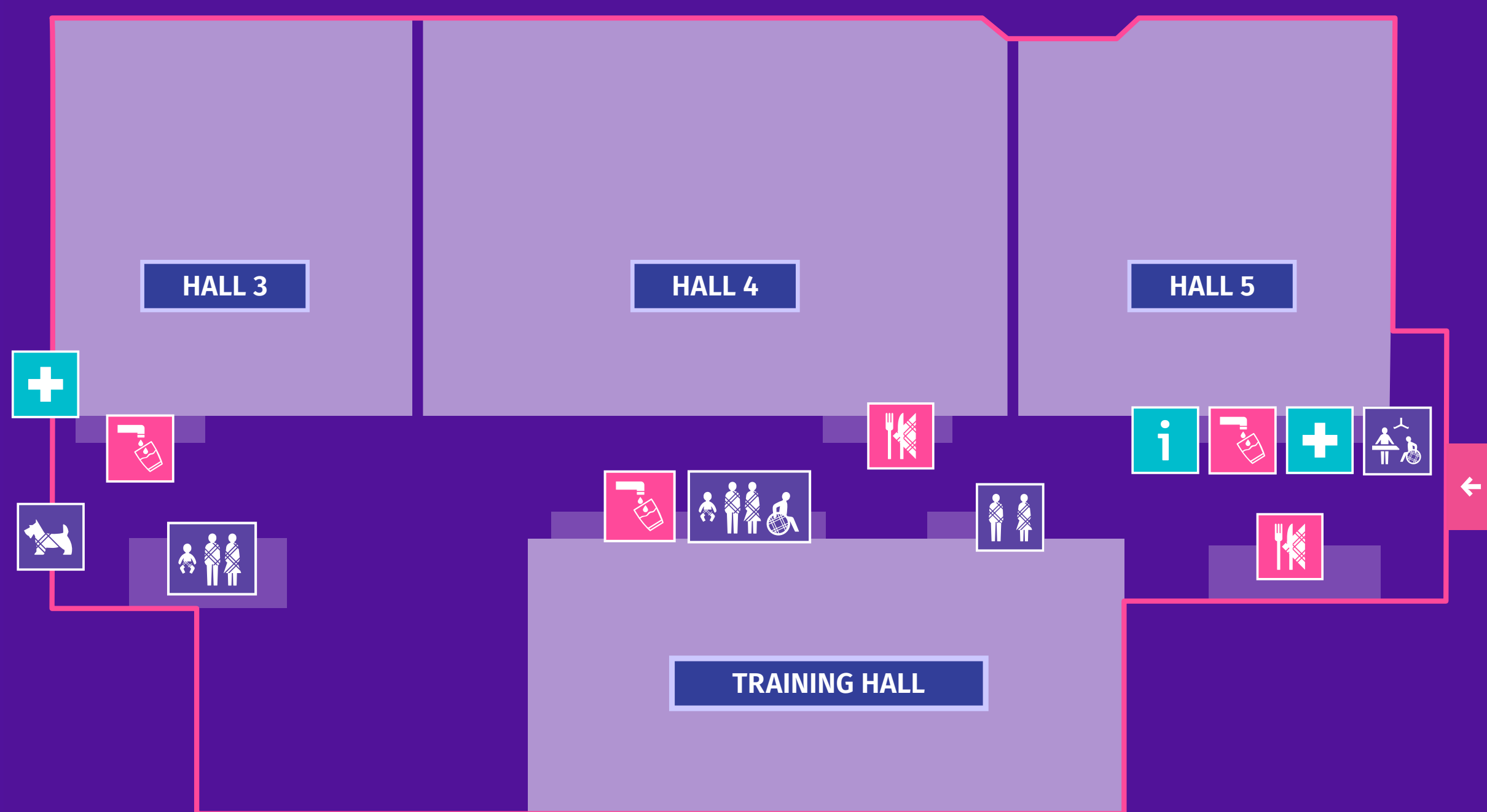

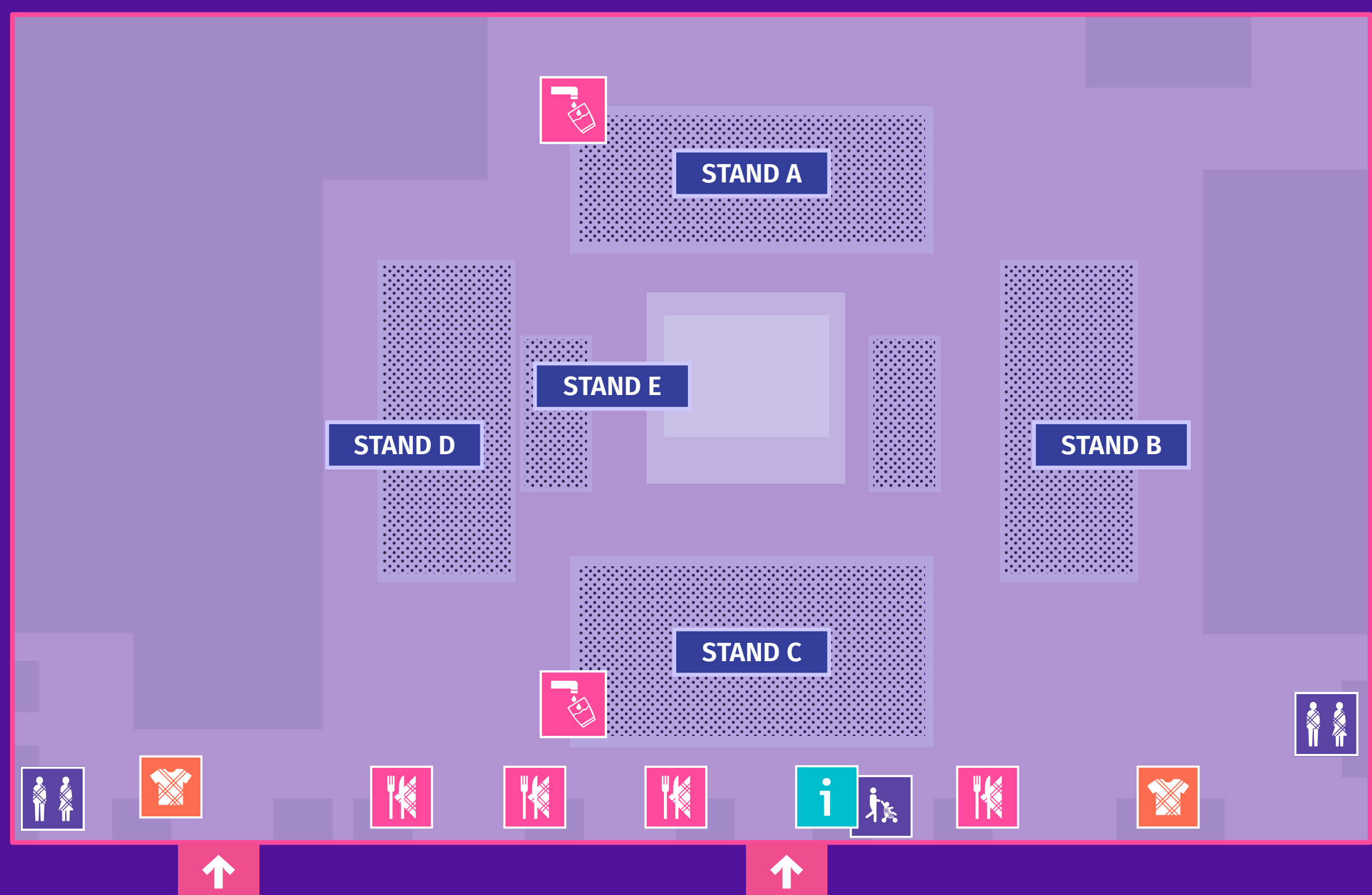

BOWLS AND PARA BOWLS

**THURSDAY 23 JULY
- SUNDAY 2 AUGUST 2026**

Bowls has been a core sport at every Commonwealth Games since 1930, with the exception of Kingston 1966. However Glasgow 2026 will be the first Commonwealth Games to host Bowls and Para Bowls indoors.

Every bowl has a bias, meaning it curves as it travels. Although a bowl can travel upwards of 30 metres, it will only move in a straight line for around 20% of the distance, with the remainder following a curved path.

Competition will be fast-paced, with up to 20 matches taking place in each session. Matches last 75 minutes with a 10 min gap between matches.

Team Scotland has enjoyed tremendous success in Bowls, sitting second in the all-time medal table with 41 medals, including 18 golds. In Para Bowls, Scotland dominated at Birmingham 2022, winning gold in all three disciplines.

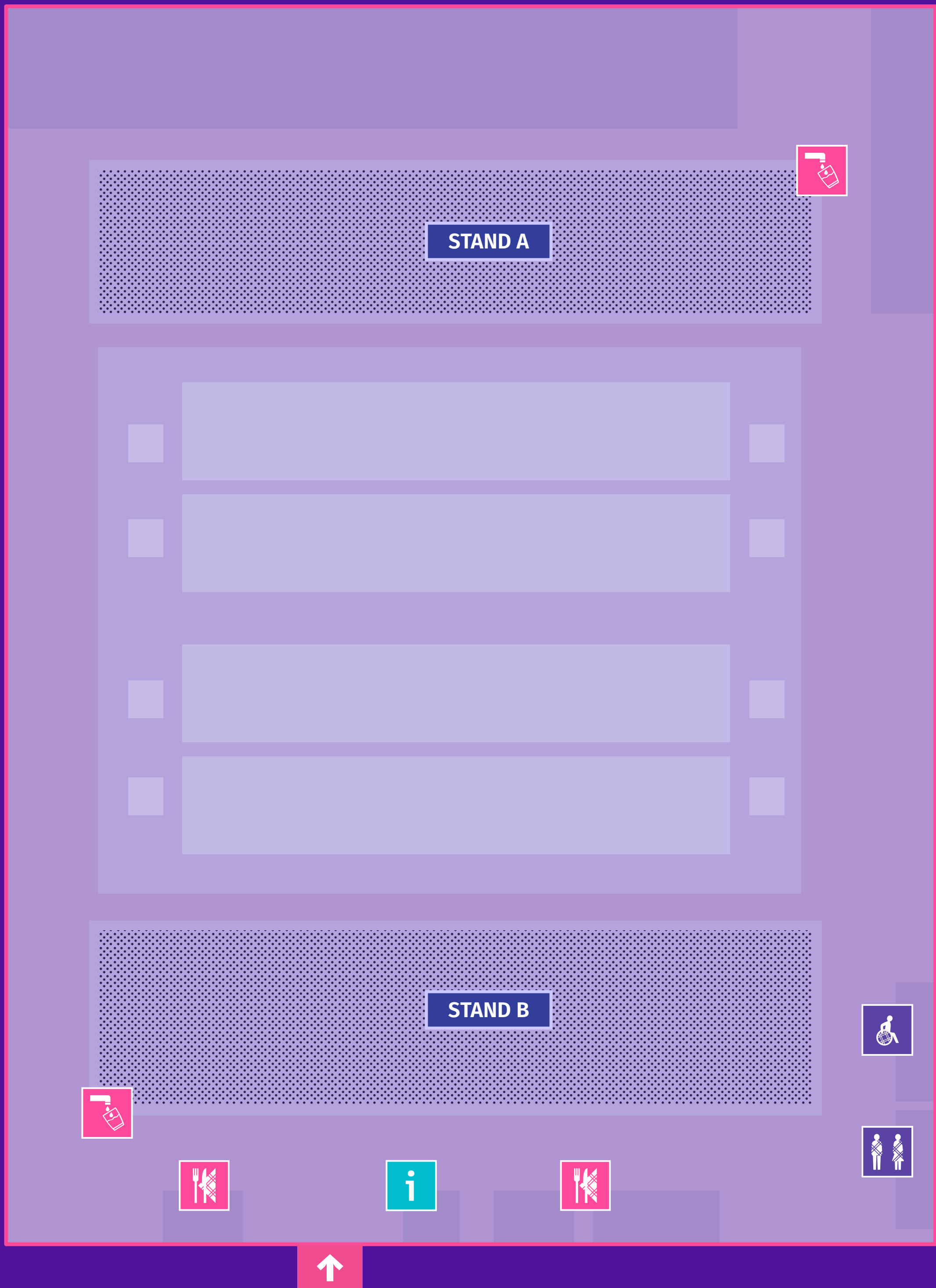

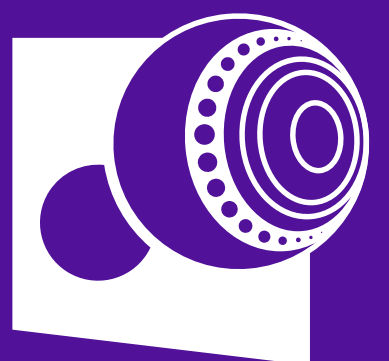

DID YOU KNOW?

Alex Marshall MBE is Scotland's most successful Commonwealth Games athlete, winning five Gold medals, one Silver and one Bronze between Manchester 2002 and Birmingham 2022.

He claimed his first World Championship Gold medal a decade earlier, in 1992.

BOXING

FRIDAY 24 JULY

– SATURDAY 1 AUGUST 2026

Boxing has featured at every Commonwealth Games since the first Games in 1930.

Few sports can match the intensity of Boxing, with closely matched athletes from around 50 nations going head-to-head in more than 200 contests over eight days of competition.

Glasgow 2026 marks another milestone as the first Commonwealth Games to feature an equal number of men's and women's weight categories – seven of each.

Blood, sweat and tears are guaranteed in Hall 5 at the SEC, and the atmosphere is sure to be electric, especially when Scottish boxers step into the ring against their rivals from England.

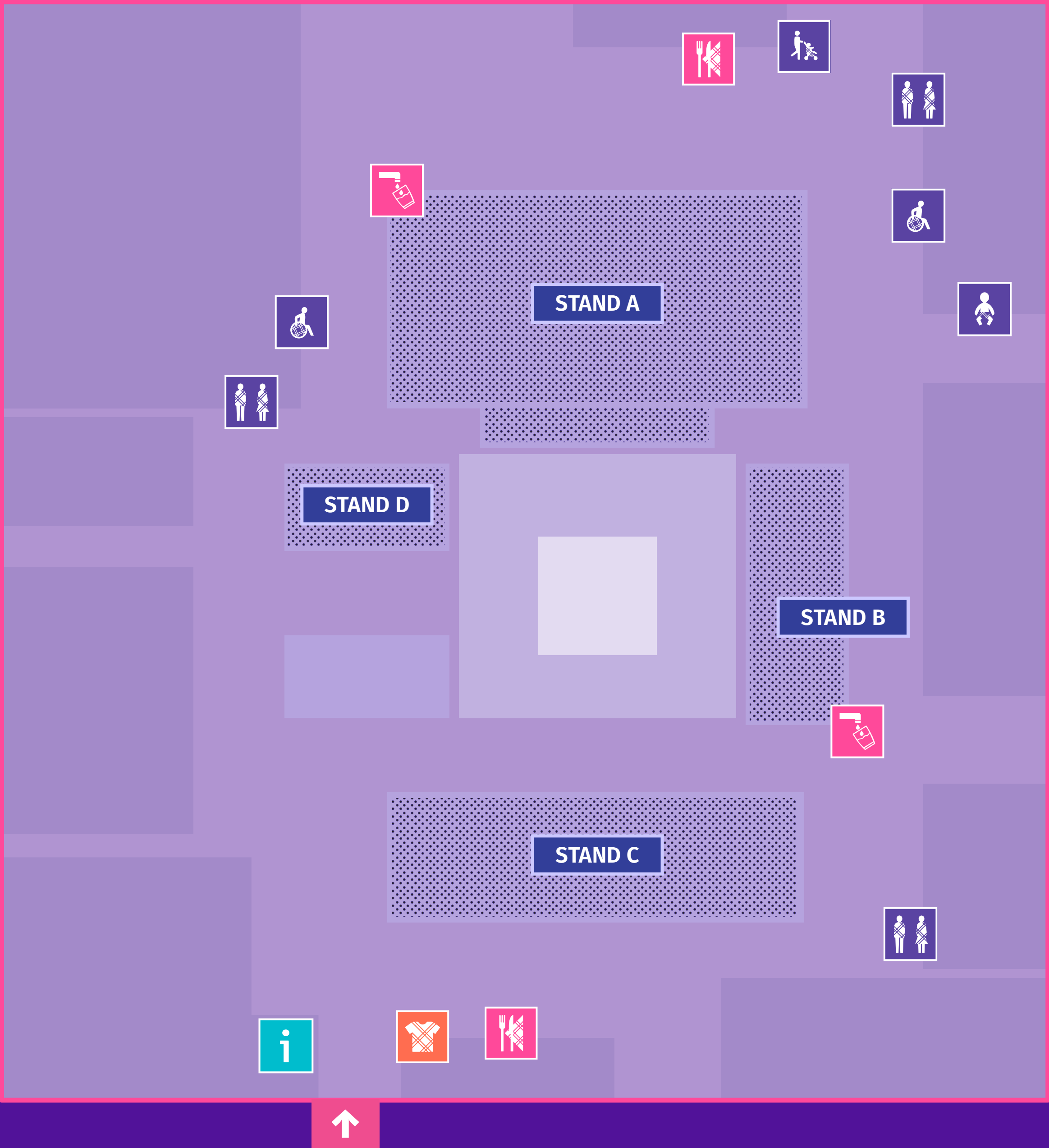

JUDO

FRIDAY 31 JULY

- SUNDAY 2 AUGUST 2026

Judo is a dynamic martial art that combines skill, speed and strategy. Athletes aim to throw, hold down or submit their opponents using technique rather than brute strength.

A thrilling part of the Commonwealth Games, Judo showcases respect, discipline and explosive action on the mat.

At Glasgow 2026, Scotland will hope to make history as Sarah Adlington targets a third consecutive Commonwealth Games gold medal in the +78kg category.

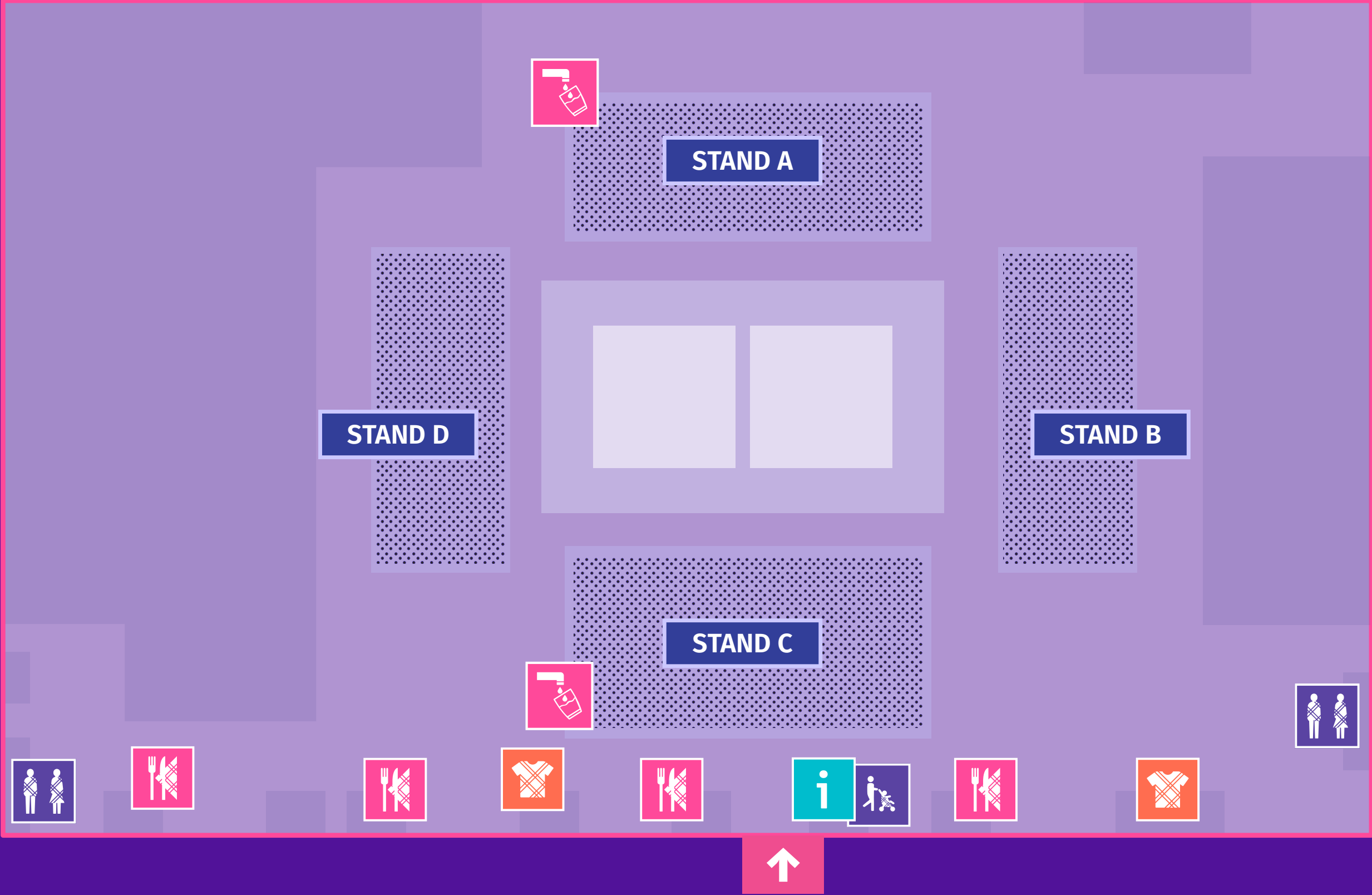

DID YOU KNOW?

Unlike most sports, Judo awards two Bronze medals in each weight category.

This unique tradition has been part of the Commonwealth Games since Judo was first included in 1990.

TRAVEL

GETTING TO AND FROM THE SEC CENTRE

BY TRAIN:

The primary station for access to the SEC Centre is Exhibition Centre which is served by trains on the Argyle Line. A lift is available at the station to assist spectators with any accessibility requirements. Exhibition Centre Station is approximately a four-minute walk through a fully covered walkway to the Spectator Entrances in the Spectator Plaza. The route from the station to the venue will be signposted. Please note, the walkway features a distinct downward slope towards the final exit.

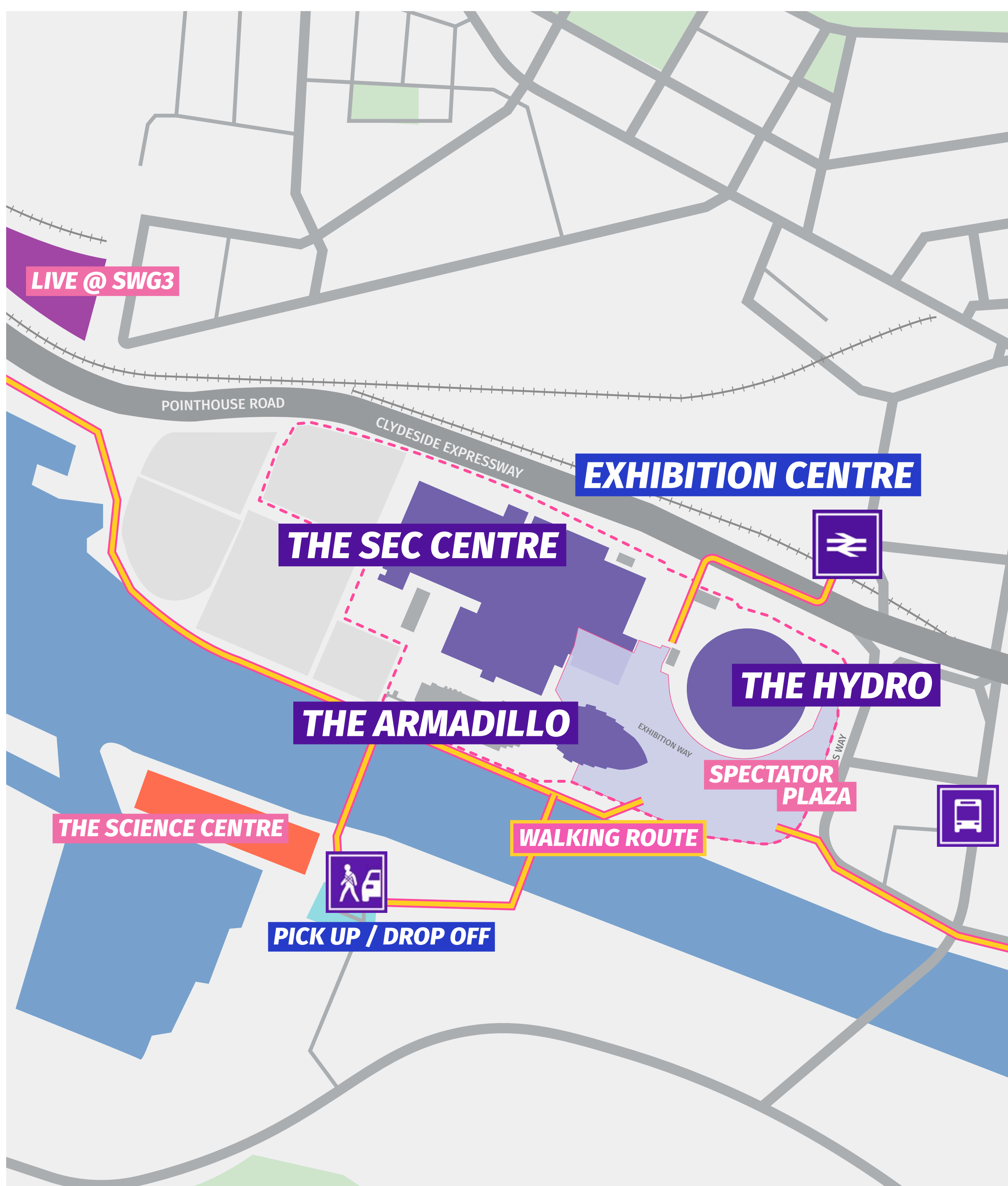
The nearest Subway stations are Partick, which is a 25-minute walk, and Ibrox, which is a 20-minute walk south of the river.

BY BUS:

Bus stops are located on Finnieston Street which is a four-minute walk from the venue and is served by the X19 bus. Bus stops are covered and have seating incorporated.

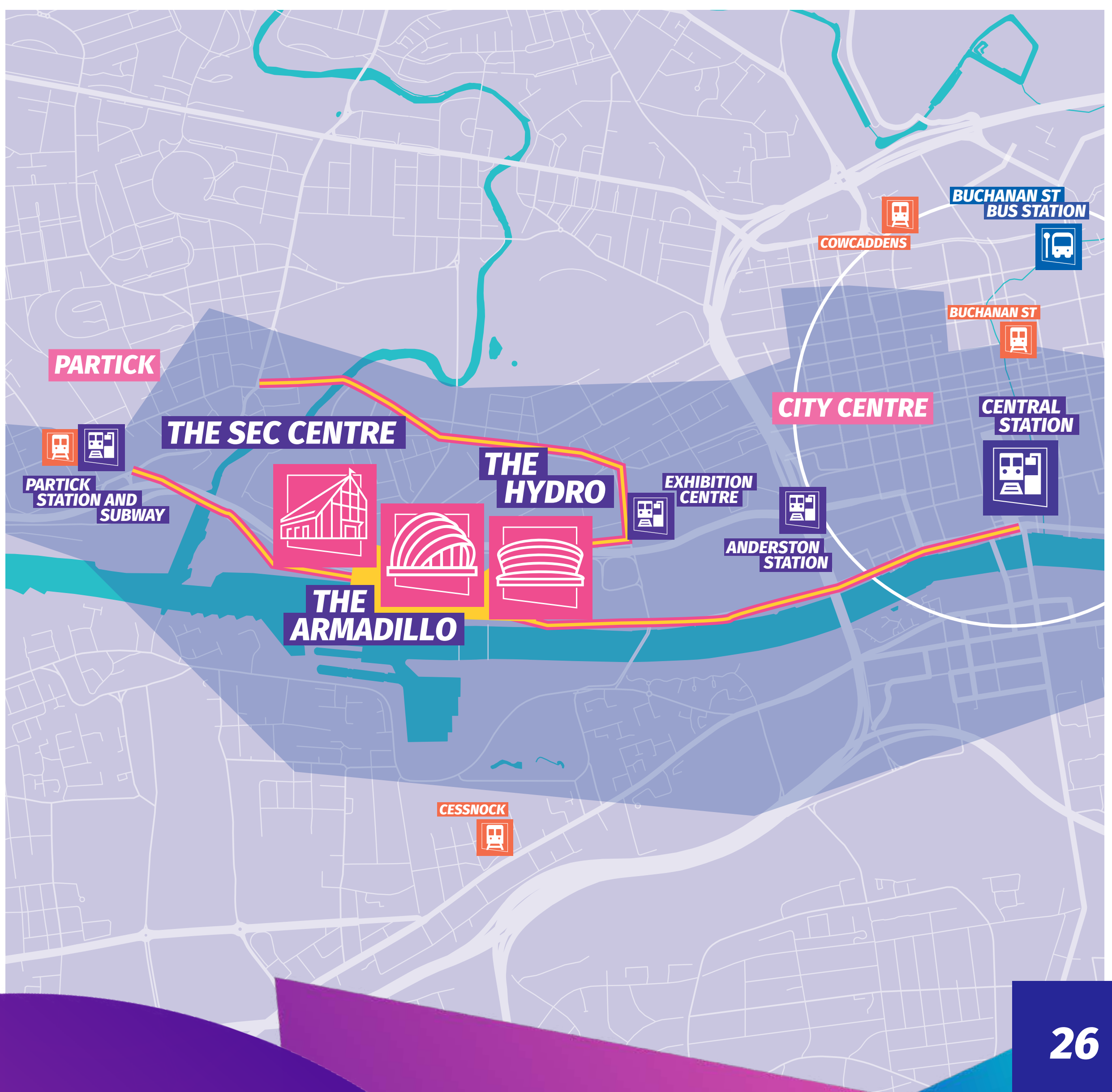
MAP SHOWING BUS, TRAIN AND DROP OFF LOCATIONS



GETTING TO AND FROM THE SEC CENTRE CONT.

BY FOOT OR WHEEL:

The most direct walking and wheeling route to and from the city centre is along the River Clyde which is approximately a 30-minute walk depending on the starting point in the city centre. The SEC Centre is easily accessible from the West End and the Southside by utilising the connecting foot bridges. This is a longer route which includes some slopes and changes in level.



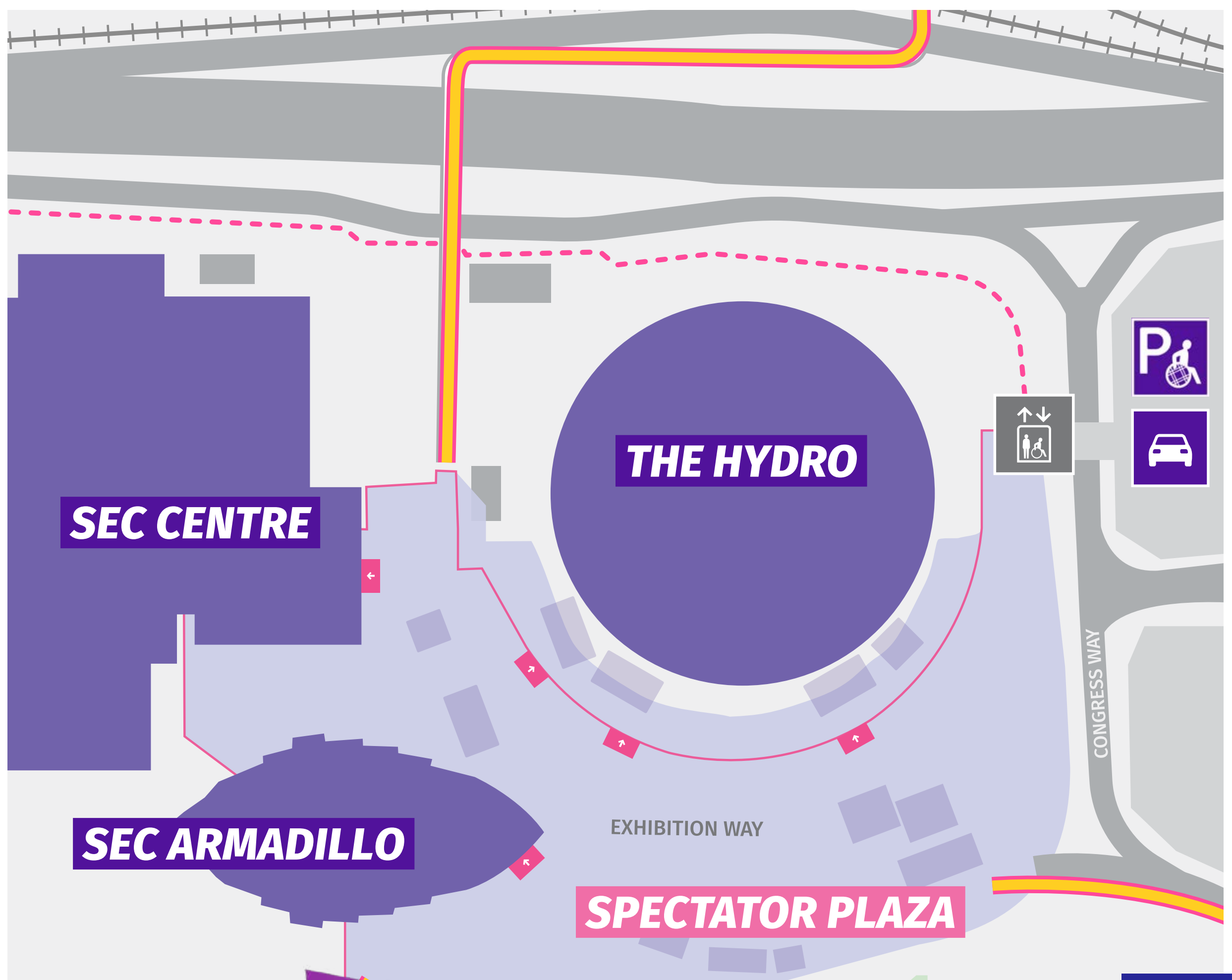
GETTING TO AND FROM THE SEC CENTRE CONT.

BY CAR:

Parking is very limited around the venue. Wherever possible, spectators are encouraged to travel by public transport or active travel.

A multi-storey car park is available adjacent to the SEC at 10 Stobcross Road, Glasgow G3 8GS and is operated by Glasgow City Council.

Parking, including accessible spaces, is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Standard parking charges apply.



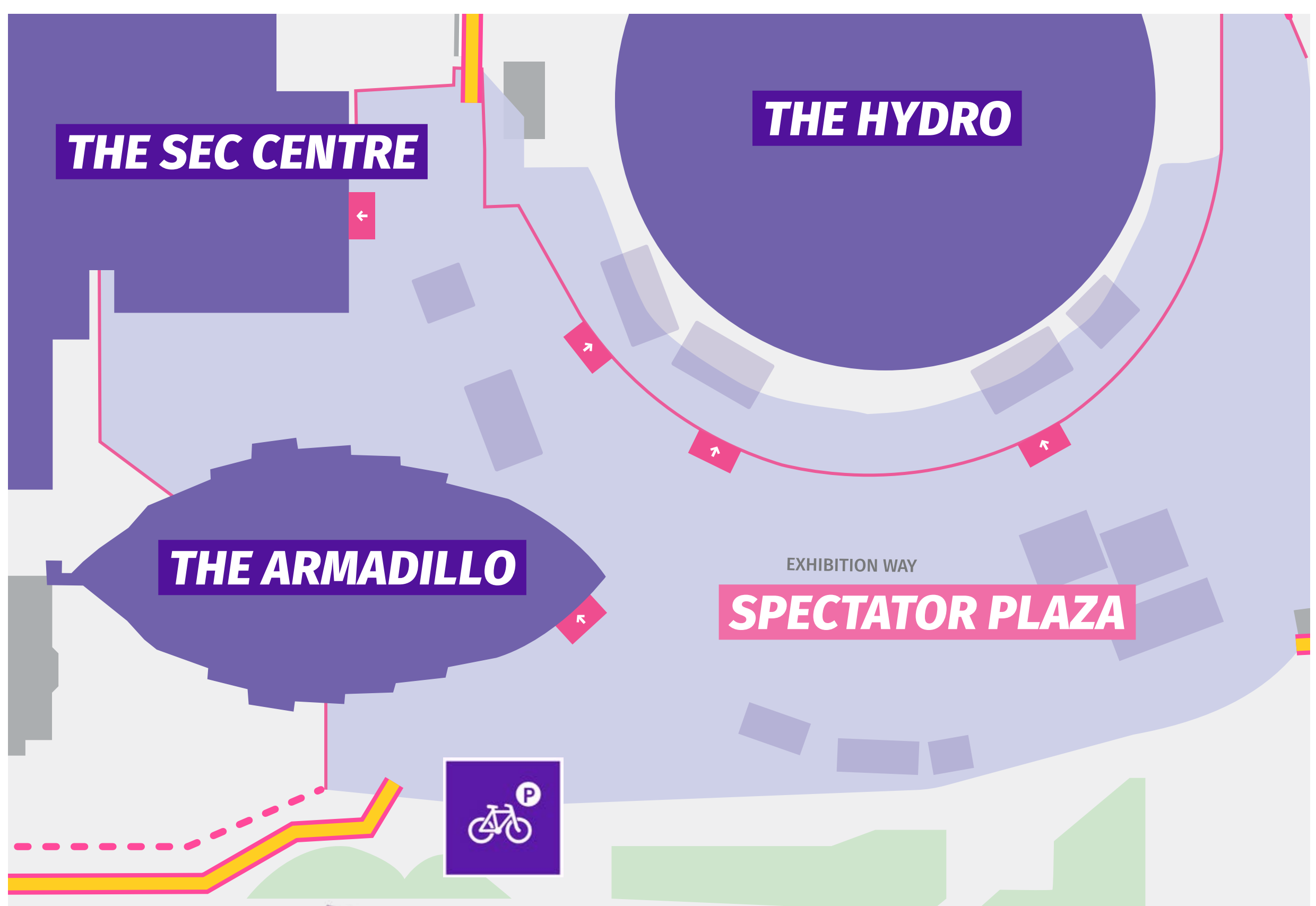
GETTING TO AND FROM THE SEC CENTRE CONT.

BY BIKE:

Bike parking will be located on Stobcross Quay along the Clyde riverside adjacent to the SEC Armadillo. Spaces are limited and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Bike parking is a self-service “lock and leave” area with plenty of room for everything from standard pedal bikes to larger frames.

Although barriered, the area is not monitored and spectators will be responsible for securing their own bike. All bikes are left entirely at the owner’s risk.



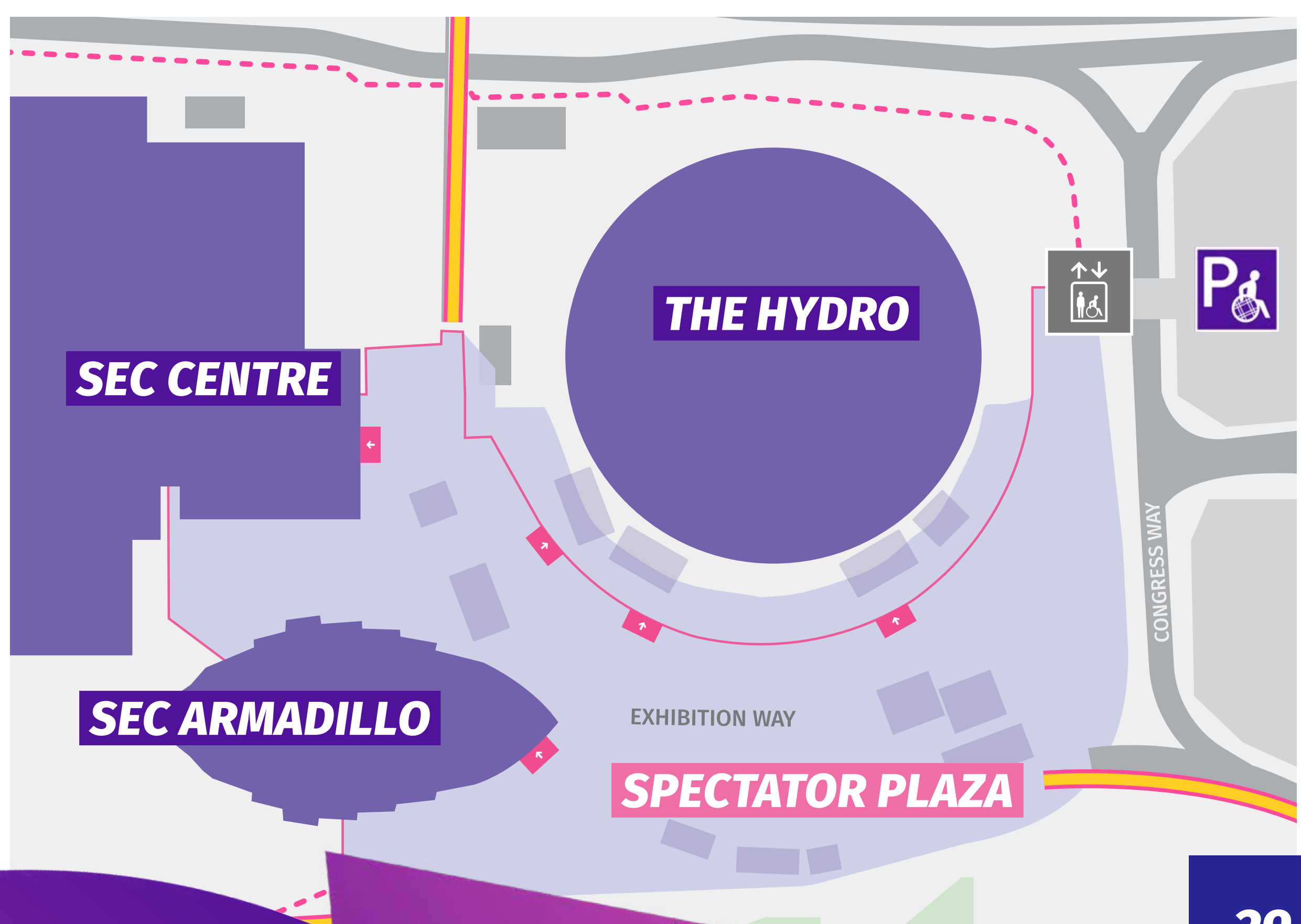

ACCESSIBLE PARKING

Accessible parking is available in the multi-storey car park adjacent to the SEC, at 10 Stobcross Road, Glasgow G3 8GS, which is operated by Glasgow City Council. Please note that accessible spaces cannot be booked in advance and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Standard parking charges apply.

The car park has an accessible walkway providing direct access to the SEC campus. Lifts are available to access each level of the multi-storey car park and the walkway.

VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Plan your journey and give yourself plenty of time to get to the venue. Please follow the rules and regulations of the event and venue.

Spectators will have access to the venue 60 minutes prior to the commencement of the relevant competition in each hall.

There will be no re-entry to the venue once the tickets have been validated. If you have any accessibility requirements, there are a wide range of accessible facilities available inside the venue.

The Spectator Entrance for the SEC Centre is off Congress Road. This is the only Spectator Entrance available at the venue and this is the same for all spectators including those using accessible parking.

An accessible lane will be open to people who have specific accessibility requirements or who are unable to stand for long periods of time. However, please note that all spectators may have to queue on arrival to enter the venue, even at our accessible entrances.

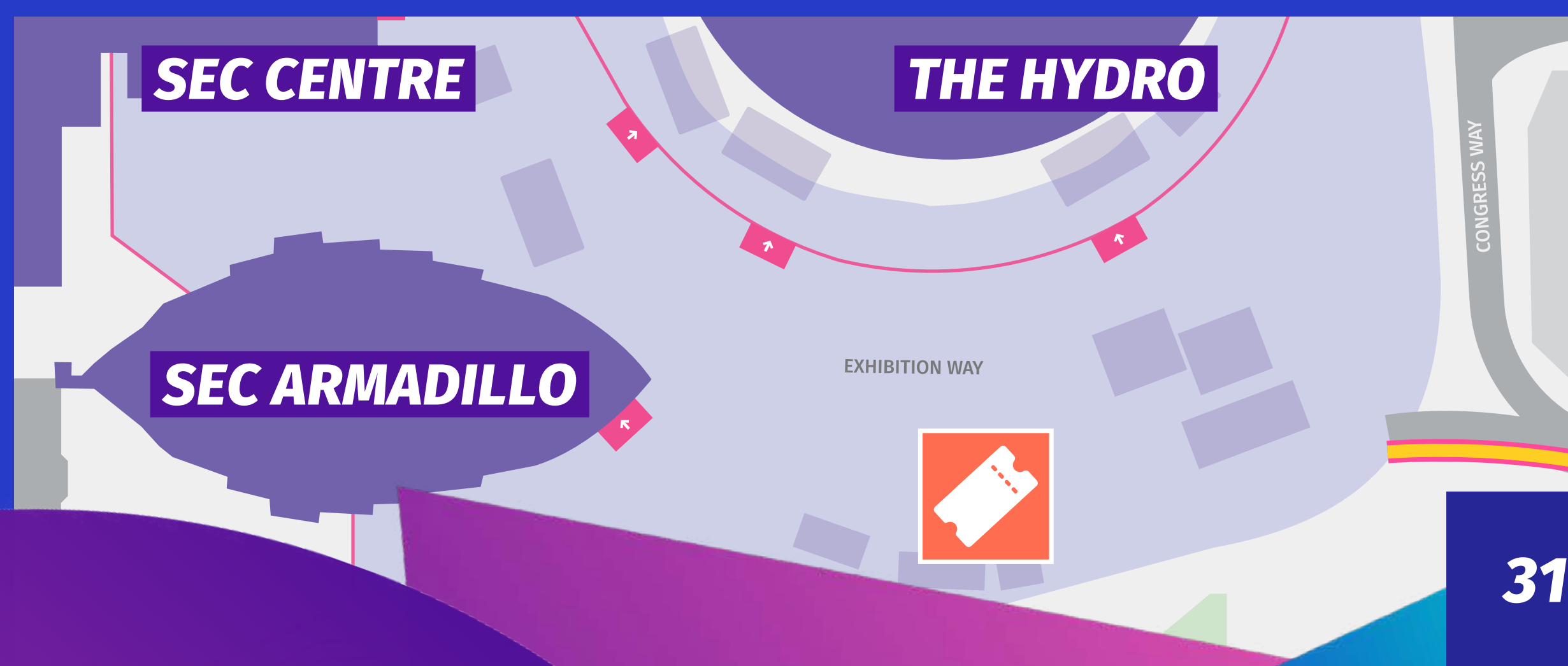
VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION CONT.

At the entrance, spectators will go through a security check. Tickets will be scanned and validated as spectators enter the competition venue/hall.

Internet and mobile signal can sometimes be variable, so make sure you have added your ticket(s) to your mobile wallet or downloaded them before you arrive. Please note that screenshots of tickets will not be permitted. [More information on Tickets is available here.](#)

If you have a ticket(s) for a second session on the same day, please note you will need to leave the venue after the first session ends. Each session is treated as a separate event and you will need to have your second session ticket(s) scanned before re-entering the venue. The venue will open 60 minutes before the second session start time.

A Ticket Office will be located in the Spectator Plaza.



PROHIBITED ITEMS



Any item that is illegal to carry or possess under UK Law



Offensive weapons knives, martial arts weapons and batons

Exceptions: Kirpan when present with other Sikh articles of faith.
Sgian-dubh worn as part of traditional Scottish dress.



Flammable substances

Flammable substances, liquids and fuel including items producing naked flames. Doesn't apply to small personal lighters.



Ambush marketing

Clothing, items, leaflets or signage with the likely purpose of engaging in Ambush Marketing.



Drones, radio transmitters, walkie talkies, radio scanners or radio jamming devices



Offensive messaging

Any item carrying wording deemed abusive, discriminatory or which may cause distress to others.



Laser pointers

Strobe lights and similar emitting devices.



Alcoholic beverages

Prohibited, unless purchased or supplied from within the venue.



Balls, rackets and frisbees

Including similar objects or projectiles and inflatables.



Any item deemed a risk to safety

Including to the bearer or other Games attendees.



Noise-making devices

Unless at specified venues communicated in the Spectator Guide.



Protest items and materials

Unless authorised by the Organising Company or Police Scotland.



Bicycles and scooters

Exception: mobility scooters and other wheeled mobility aids.



Firearms

Including hoax or replica items.



Fireworks or flares

Including pyrotechnic devices.



Cans, glass bottles or containers



Incapacitant sprays

e.g., pepper spray



Selfie sticks



Non-prescription drugs



Portable oxygen cylinders

Unless for medical use.

RESTRICTED ITEMS



Beverage containers

One full, sealed, plastic, beverage container, or an empty resealable plastic or metal container not exceeding 750ml in volume.
No alcohol permitted.



Photography

Only mobile phones, single external (mobile phone) power sources, personal use cameras or lenses of no more than 30cm in length will be allowed. No professional and broadcast equipment including tripods and monopods are allowed except for accredited media.



Medicines

Medically prescribed in quantity for individual personal use, commercially packaged, and labelled with contents. All other non-prescribed medication at the discretion of the Security Team Leader.



Food

Limited amount for personal consumption and non-commercially branded. Including reasonable amounts of baby food, milk, formula and food for dietary needs.



Prams/baby carriers

These are not allowed in seating areas, but can be left in buggy storage at venues.



Vapes & E-cigarettes

Or other battery powered devices used to heat a liquid for personal inhalation.



Portable seats

Chairs, folding chairs, stadium seats, allowed when required for a disability or injury. At the discretion of Security Team Leader.



Animals

With the exception of certified assistance dogs.



Suncream

Up to 200ml and other liquids, aerosols, creams and gels up to 100ml in non-glass containers.



Umbrellas

Must be small enough to fit inside a small bag. Not to be opened inside the venue or stands where it would restrict the view of others. No golf umbrellas.



Flags

National flags of competing nations, Union flag, LGBTQ+ flag (and individual community flags) max size 0.5m x 1m. No flag poles. Small, hand-held flags on plastic sticks allowed. Flags of non-competing nations are restricted and should not be visible in the seating bowl.



Bags

One per person, soft-sided bags, no greater than 48cm in length, 34cm in height and 23cm in depth.

RESTRICTED ITEMS

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

All Glasgow 2026 venues are smoke-free. Smoking, including the use of electronic cigarettes or vapes, is not permitted within any Games venue or outside in any Spectator Plaza areas across the SEC Campus.

Photography and filming for personal use is permitted. However, tripods, monopods and other photographic equipment are considered restricted items and are not permitted inside the venue.

Please respect other spectators and their right to enjoy this event. This includes refraining from using foul and abusive language and engaging in any other disruptive behaviour.

Stay hydrated and take breaks when needed. Sporting events can be long and tiring, so make sure you take care of yourself. Refillable water bottles up to 750ml are permitted.

VENUE FACILITIES

There is an Information Point located within the main concourse of the SEC Centre and one in each Hall. There is also an Information Point in the Spectator Plaza of the SEC Campus.

The Information Point is your best place for information on the venue, the available services and the Games.

VENUE FACILITIES CONT.

Buggies, prams, and venue-loaned wheelchairs are not permitted in our general seating areas.

There are storage areas in each Hall of the SEC Centre and at the Information Point in the Spectator Plaza. Please note, any item is left at your own risk.

Merchandise, Food and Drink outlets and Water Refill points are available in the venue.

If you require medical assistance while at the venue, any member of staff or steward will support you. A Medical and First Aid point is located inside the main entrance of the SEC Centre to the right.

Baby Change facilities are available within the SEC Centre concourse, and can be accessed using a radar key collected from the Information Point. There are also changing tables in most accessible toilets across the SEC Campus. Please ask a member of staff or volunteer for the nearest one.

ACCESSIBILITY

The Spectator Entrance for the SEC Centre is off Congress Road.

Accessible toilets are located across the venue. Radar keys are available from stewards or from the Information Point.

A Changing Places toilet is available at the SEC Centre. Please speak to a member of the team to support with access. Radar keys are available from stewards or from the Information Point. It will not appear on the Changing Places website as you must be a ticket holder to access this facility.

Assistive Listening Devices, including Hearing Loops are available at the Information Point in the SEC Centre. These are available for loan on a first-come, first-served basis from the Information Point in the venue. These must be returned to the Information Point before leaving the venue.

A wheelchair loan service, provided by Allied Mobility, is available from the Information Point in the SEC Centre and the Spectator Plaza. Please note wheelchair loans are to assist in travelling across the venue and will not be available to hire for the full session. Spectators requiring a wheelchair are encouraged to [pre-register their details online via the SEC Accessibility portal](#) at least 48 hours prior to their event. A walk-up

service will also be available at the Information Point subject to availability.

The Family Rest Area in the Spectator Plaza is a shared welfare space for use of any spectator on a first-come, first-served basis.

Sensory Bags containing a fidget toy, sensory distraction, earplugs/ear defenders, and a feelings card will be available for loan on a first-come first-served basis from the Information Points in the SEC Centre and the Spectator Plaza. These must be returned to the Information Point upon leaving the venue. Spectators requiring a Sensory Bag are encouraged to [pre-register their details online via the SEC Accessibility portal](#) at least 48 hours prior to their event. A walk-up service will also be available at the Information Point subject to availability.

There is an Assistance Dog Relief Area located south of the Hydro, next to the Spectator Plaza.



TICKETS

Your tickets will be delivered by email, with links to add them to either Apple Wallet or Google Wallet.

You will also be able to access and **download your tickets as PDFs** from your Ticketmaster Sport account.

We recommend adding your tickets to your mobile wallet or downloading them in advance, so they are ready before you travel to the venue.

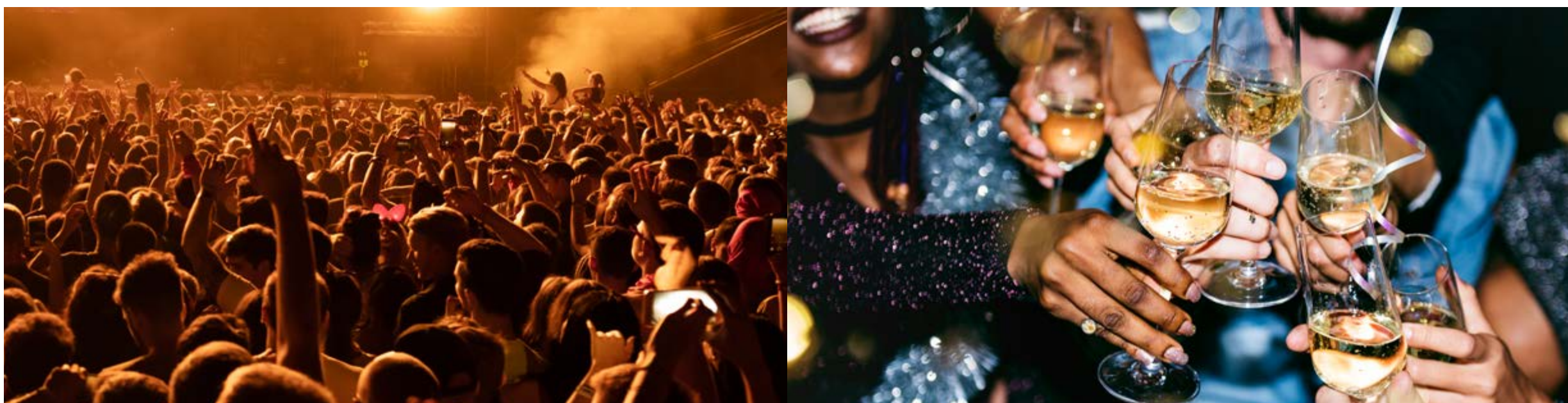
